9:30 CLOSING BILL SIGNED.

Home Rule Measure is Changed to Meet Governor's Objections.

Austin, Texas, April 1.—The governor today approved and signed the 9:30 closing law. This is known as the criminal bill and provides for 9:30 closing of saloons.

The enabling act is back in the executive department, having passed finally again last night in both branches after the initiative, referendum and recall feature had been eliminated. Section nine, to which the governor also objected, was changed so as to make the state law prevail when there is a conflict with the state law and the charter provisions. Representative Tarver says the governor will now approve the bill.

The house late last night rejected the free conference committee report on the congressional redistricting bill by a vote of 70 to 33.

The efforts of the pros to finally pass the Lattimore anti-club bill went to naught today when the chair sustained the point of order that bills cannot be considered within 24 hours of final adjournment.

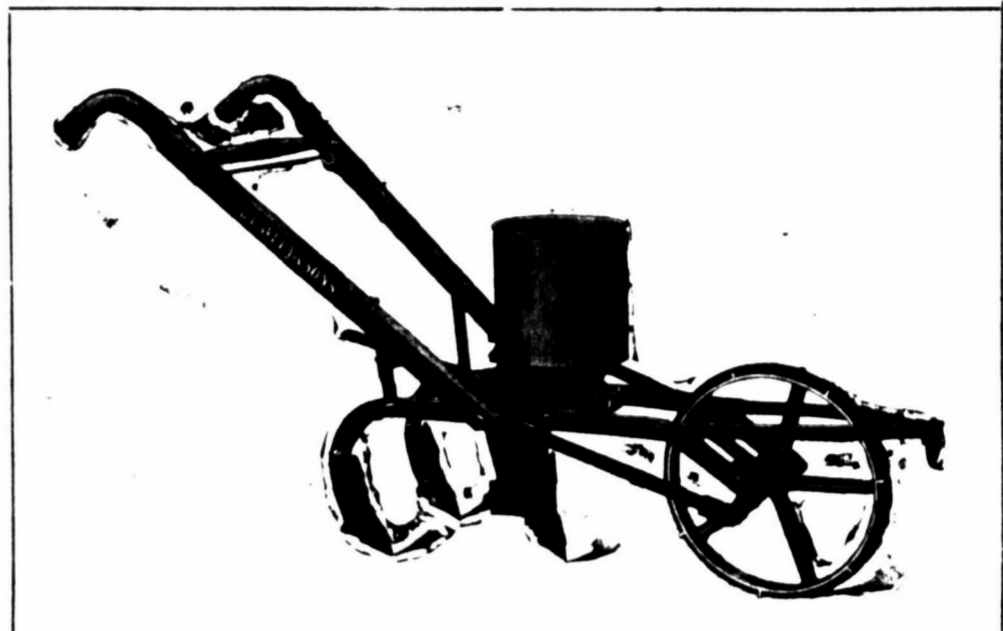

As disastrous as the floods in the central west and north have been, it is pleasing to note that the loss of life is so much less than at first reported. The loss as it is staggers the entire country with the awfulness of it.

THE contest in the Tenth district for the seat in congress vacated by the appointment of Congressman Albert S. Burleson to be post master general is creating considerable interest. J. P. Buchanan of Washington county, and John C. Calhoun for Travis are in the race of the position and the friends of each candidate are busying themselves in the interest of their candidate.

It is quite noticeable that wagons from the country are loaded with a considerable amount of feed stuffs, such as hay and chops, when they leave town. This is not a very good indication. The farmer who raises a big cotton crop and not enough feed, for his teams, has to spend the money received for the cotton to buy feed, when he could raise the feed much cheaper than at the price he has to pay the dealers.

THE dispatches state that Adrianople has at last been entered by the Bulgarian army after a terrific battle and that now the city is being devastated by flames. Turkey might have just as well given up this tortress long ago instead of insisting on its retention even at the renewal of the war, with its consequent loss in life and property. The Turk was whipped to a frazzle when the peace conference met to arrange terms.

Tradition Regarding Greece.

The accession of Constantine and Sophia as King and Queen of the Hellenes significantly recalls the tradition which has existed for centuries that Constantinople is to be rescued from Turkish rule and Santa Sophia is to become again a Christian church when a royal pair of those names shall be sovereign in Greece. The tragedy at Saloniki has realized the first part of that prophecy, and the deeds of the allied armies have made the remainder seem immeasurably less remote and less improbable than it was a year ago.—New York Tribune.

Colquitt Wants Changes Made in Allison Liquor Bill.

Austin, Texas, March 26.—In a message to the house of representatives Governor Colquitt today asked that the Allison bill forbidding interstate shipment of liquors into local option territory be recalled for correction. He suggests that the bill should be amended to provide equal punishment for the person receiving liquor in local option territory with the person shipping the liquor into such territory. He says that while the bill would place the shipper in the penitentiary and the penalty is a bit severe, yet he believes that if the receiver would be punished likewise, there would be absolute enforcement of the local option laws.

"In our criminal statutes provision is made where a person receives and conceals stolen property that he is likewise as guilty as the man who actually commits theft, and I believe this provision should be supplied in the proposed act herein referred to," he says.

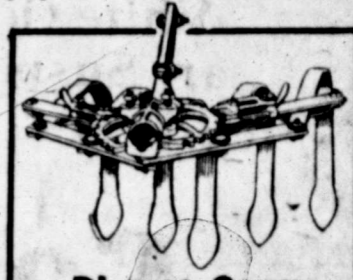

New York, March 26.—The advisability of distributing for general use by physicians the tuberculosis vaccine discovered by Dr. Friedman was discussed at a conference of the German physician and a number of physicians.

Under a proposed plan physicians from various parts of the country might be instructed in the Friedman method of inoculating patient. It was declared that Dr. Friedman expressed an eagerness to have no other use his treatment so that a great number of sufferers might be attended.

Decision of the matter was held in abeyance, but an announcement may be made by the end of the week, it was said.

WANTS ABSOLUTE PROOF.

Troubles of Scientist Who Is Seeking Recognition Not Yet Over.

Washington, March 28.—Before the public health service can determine the efficacy of Dr. Friedmann's tuberculosis remedy, it must have his vaccine and know the method of its preparation and use. This is still withheld by the German physician, and the government experts are proceeding as rapidly as possible with a study of the cultures he had submitted. Before the examination is concluded, however, it will be necessary for the surgeons to study the vaccine and all its properties.

To expedite the government's investigation, Surgeon General Blue yesterday announced the appointment of Surgeon P. H. Lavindre of the public health service as a member of the committee of investigation.

The 60 patients now under treatment in New York are regarded by Dr. Blue as an insufficient number upon which to reach quick conclusions. He believes 200 or more should be inoculated. Dr. Lavinder, with Dr. A. M. Stinson will observe the inoculated patients.

There is considerable discussion being indulged in over the entire East Texas country, as to whether the fruit crop is killed or not; some holding that as the last freeze came between a light damage and the development of the effects of the first freeze, it would be hard to tell for a while yet how badly the last freeze damaged. Even if the fruit crop is gone, we will still have the cantelope and watermelon and they are two mighty good fruits. There is always something good in East Texas, and no one was ever known to starve here.

Texas Largest Cotton Crop

Washington, D. C., March 27.—The largest cotton crop in the history of the State was produced in Texas in 1912 according to the final report of the Department of Agriculture. The output was 5,120,252 bales compared with 4,447,648 in 1911 and exceeded the estimate made by the Department of Agriculture on the 1912 crop by 270,252 bales.

The total production of the United States for 1912 was 14,295,500 bales which was the second largest crop ever grown. Texas produced 35 per cent or more than one third of the total production.

Preparing for Confederate Reunion

Chattanooga, Tenn., March 27.—Chattanooga has decided to raise from \$50,000 to \$75,000 for entertainment of the reunion of confederate veterans to be held here May 27-29. Committees are at work securing cash and subscriptions from the business men and concerns of the city and community. The fund will be secured without delay.

Since the formal organization nearly two months ago, the reunion work has been pushed with energy by thirty committees. The camp for the veterans has been selected and named. It will be in Jackson Park, a splendid location near the business section of the city. The camp can be reached by three street car lines, all of which will operate special schedules to accommodate the veterans. It is planned to have a street car pass the camp every minute.

The camp has been named "Camp Stewart" in honor of the late Gen. A. P. Stewart, the renowned confederate chieftain. Tents and cots to the number of 1,400 and 10,000 respectively, have been secured from the United States war department for the camp.
