Austin, Texas, March 26.n a message to the house of representatives Governor Col quitt today asked that the Allison bill forbidding interstate shipment of liquors into ocal option territory be re called for correction. He uggests that the bill should a punishment to receiving liquor in local option territory with the person shipping the liquor into such territoy. He says that while he bill would place the shipper in the penitentiary and the penalty is a bit severe ret he believes that if the re eiver would be punished likewise, there would be absolute entorcement of the local op. tion laws.
"In our criminal statutes provision is made where a person receives and conceals tolen property that he is likewise as guilty as the man who ctually commits thett, and I elieve this provision should be supplied in the proposed act herein referred to," he .
