## Slaughtering of The Birds.

Dr. William T. Hornaday irector of New York Zoologi al Park, estimates that it the bird population of this counry was as large toaay as it was 60 vears ago it would mean a saving of $\$ 250,000,000$ o American tarmers, says Democrat and Chronicle. There is a direct connection, in his opinion, between the multiplication of insect pests, which are among the gravest problem of modern agriculure; and the slaughter of migratory birds. In 50 years he says, the bird lite in this country has dwindled 75 per ent. Thirteen species
aigratory birds have been entirely exterminated, and 30 ore are traveling the same oad. At this rate in 25 years cald be practically no called game birds, except those in game preserves. On
the other hand, with sweeping national protective laws in five vears the county would teem with birds again. There is no use in mourning now over the shortsightness and olly that has wrought such havoc among teathered crea ures.
