"The two primary objects of cultivating a crop are first, ond, to kill weeds. Deep cultivation will conserve very little more moisture than shallow cultivation and possesses three very serious dis advantages: 1st - destroys the feeding roots of the crop; 2nd is wasteful of plantfood, as the food elements contain ed in that portion of the soil that is constently stirred are not available to the crop, because the roots are kept out of the soil, 3rd-deep cultivation usually leaves the surtace of the soil very uneven, again shallow and trequent cultivation destroys all weed seeds in the upper layer Ct the soil and does not bring to the surface weed seecs that minate Deep preparation and shallow cultivation should be the rule,
