"While the consumer complains about the price he pavs tor tarm products" said Senator Fleteher, "that complant is not to be lodged against the tarmer-the producer. Somewhere between the tarm and the dinner table billions of dollars, probably seven billion, disappear annually. Some portion of this belongs to the tarmer. Some portion of it
