

It was sold at auction this morning by John S. Doughtie to Thomas & Richardson for 20 cents a pound. The seed were bought by the Nacogdoches Cotton Oil Co. for \$6.15. A premium of \$55.25 was made up by the business men of the city. The bale weighed 387 pounds. It netted the grower \$138.80.

In the last twenty-nine years Mr. Doughtie has sold twenty five of the first bales, the other four first bales were sold while Mr. Doughtie was out of the state.
