"sorghum"-when eaten by cattle during certain stage tits development is a deadly poison on account of the prussic acid which it contains. world over as one of the mos dange
soas."

Sorghum retarded or stunt ed in growth contains a lar ger per cent of prussic aci than does that which grow rapidly and develops into healthy vigorous plant. The leaves are more heavily load talk. As much as 1 cent prussic acid has been extracted from green sorghum leaves. This would mean would contain a fatal dose for n ordinary cow or steer. In mature sorghum the stalk and seeds do not contain pruscacid.
There is an erroneous impression abroad to the effect hat it is only the second crop orghum which is poison ect as the first crop concor $s$ large per cent of the poison $s$ does the second crop. How ver this erroneous idea rises rom the fact that the firs rop is rarely ever pastured whereas it is not at all urusual, especially in the earl all, for cattle to be turned into fields where the shoot and the voung plant of second growth or crop are develop ing. It is under these condi hould tear death from sorg hum poison. Every year in Tennessee during the late summer and early fall hun dreds of cattle are lost from poison of this character
Experiments to date Eonstrate that dry, clear weather, by arresting the nor mal development of the plant, is the chiet cause of the for mation of ab
ies of poison.
