Nanking, China,
August 18, 1913 doches. Texas. Dear Mother: It is just a month ago since we left Shanghai to patrol
the river ports along the Yangtsze Kiang, as stated in he letters you have received trom mes since that time. Dur
ing this month we have been going from port to port in or der that we might be presen ing on, but each time upon our arrival at a port were des-
tined to find everything quieted down
Friday and Saturday, 15th and 16 th inst., Iwe were hoping to return to Shanghai or Tsingtsu and get shore leave,
as the money we were paid on as the money we were paid on
the 6th is still in our pockets awaiting an opportunity to show us a good time.
Yesterday morning arrived but instead of seeing us go down the river, we hauled in
our anchors and stcod up here where it was reported that the rebels were making their last stand against the army of President Yuan Shi upon them from the north. The distance from Chin kiang up here is 47 miles. We got under way at 8:00 a.
m . and at 10:50 picked up the sound of heavy gun firing from the direction of Nan king.

## At noon we arrived at Nan-

## Exports of Mineral Oi's.

According to the cfficial figures of the Bureau of For eign and Domestic Commerc Department of Commerce, mineral oil exported in the fiscal vear 1913 aggregated 137 million dollars' val against 67 million in 1903 having increased 104 per cen tions during the decade. T quantity exported was nearly 2 billion gallons,
more exact, 1,990 million gal lons against 964 million a de cade ago, having increased 106 per cent during the dt cade. The quantity exported in the crude state is slightly less in 1913 than in 1912, but shows a gain of 45 per cent over 1913, while illuminatıng oil, lubricating oil, and naphthas and other lighter pro ducts. including gasoline show large gains.
