

It has been computed that there are 4,500,000 cubic miles of rock salt in the oceans, tourteen and a half times the bulk of the contin nent of Europe above high water mark. The Atlantic is much saltier than other oceans. We are publishing below a private letter from Scott Ratcliff to his mother, Mrs. W. G. Ratcliff, giving a report from the war of the Chinese which will be interesting reading. Scott is on the United States ship Saratoga, which is in Chinese waters, watching the fight:

> U: S. S. Saratoga, Nanking, China, August 18, 1913.

Mrs. W. G. Ratcliff, Nacog doches, Texas.

Dear Mother:

It is just a month ago since we left Shanghai to patrol the river ports along the Yangtsze Kiang, as stated in the letters you have received from me since that time. During this month we have been going from port to port in or der that we might be present where there was fighting going on, but each time upon our arrival at a port were destined to find everything quiet ed down,

Friday and Saturday, 15th and 16th inst., we were hop ing to return to Shanghai or Tsingtsu and get shore leave as the money we were paid on the 6th is still in our pockets awaiting an opportunity to show us a good time.


