Sixty head of Blossom Hill Daroc-Jersey hogs topped the Fort Worth market Thursday, going at \$7.90. This consignment of East Texas hogs was of pure type raised on the W. B. Wortham tarm five miles from Garrison in Nacogdoches county.

Wortham came to Fort Worth with the consignment and spent most of the day on the market, returning to Garri son Thursday night. The hogs averaged 207 pounds and were composed of barrows and gilts.






