#### Substantial Improvements Over T & P.

Dallas, Texas, November 27, — The Texas & Pacitic Railway has begun the work of laying 75 pound steel rails on the itranscontinental diivsion of the road, according to John'W. Everman, general superintendent. The first stretch of the new work is from Sherman eastward, about 30 miles. This part of the division will be completed before work is begun further east. The track is also being surfaced as the steel is placed. Of the 1,000,-000 ,new ties bought by this road for improvements on the system, 160,000 have been allotted to the transcontinental division. The new ties are being used under the steel now being laid.
