## B. F. Lacy Drowned.

In the daily papers, among ther casualties recorded during the present floods, appears the name ot B. F. Lacy. who lost his lite near Dallas. It seems that Mr. Lacy wa working with cattle, trying to get them to high ground, when he became entangled and lost his life.
