



The one expected thing in connection with the passage by the United States Senate of the Alaska railroad bill is the small vote in opposition. The bill was bound to pass, it for no other reason than that this great project of a Government railroad for the development of Alaska is to be the Administration's reply to possible attacks by conservationists in the next Con gressional campaign. there was no assurance that the opposition would tade away so notably on the roll call. The House can not now muster the votes necessary to deteat this legislation. 




