He received medical attention as soon as possible and is reported to be doing alright today. Mr. Matthews, home is in Nacogdoches and he was removed here immediately.


#### Depet at Weden Burned.

City of Mexico, Feb. 12.-Rebels today again cut off the oil supply from Tampico over the railroad into San Luis Potosi, this time emphasizing their work by the destruction of a passenger train, wiping out military escort and killing and wound ing many passengers.

At Las Canos, twenty-five miles south of Caadenas, dynamite mines were exploded beneath a passenger train from Tampico. battle between the federal escort of fitty and the rebels ensued in which all the tederals were killed. Most of the passengers fled to the brush and some succeeded in reaching nearby stations. The train was destroyed by fire after which the rebels tore up almost a mile of track. A military train has been dispatched from Cardenas to the scene.

Mexican officials so far have made no effort at retaliation against American residents here since the litting of the embargo on arms from the United States, but it is no secret that the close personal relations formerly existing between Charge O'Shaughnessy and President Huerta are strained. They have not seen each other since the day the embargo was lifted though Mr. O'Shaughnessy has sent to the president a note protesting against the animus displayed by the newspaper Imparcial. The president did not answer the note but the foreign office tonight ordered the Imparcial to cease its attacks on





100,000 Texas Farmers Have 'Phones

Fort Worth, Tex. Feb. 18-For the purpose of studying efficiency in their work, more than fitty district managers of the Southwestern Telegraph & Telephone Company met in this city yesterday. Recently inaugurated rules were carefully studied and explained and plans for the betterment of the service were discussed.

It was unanimously decided to reach out for the farmer's trade during the present year and many new telephone lines ing her sister Mrs. L. F. will be built into the rural districts of Texas during 1914. At the present time there are more than 100,000 telephones in use by Texas farmers. Approximately 25 per cent of the white farmers of this state already have 'phones.
