Seed Cotton For Planting. Cotton being the principa money crop of Nacogduches county, it is theretore ver mportant that the seed used in planting should be of high germination, in ord
tain a good stand.
ain a good stand.
The tarmer as a rule pay verv little attention to thi important factor in the pro duction of his crop, as long as
the seed is of good size and color, picked trom good grow ing plants, is about as tar as the ordinary tarmer goes in selecting his cotton seed, with which to plant the most important crop on his farm.
Owing to heavy rains
Owing to heavy rains of
ast September large per cent ot the cotton seed in the county is unfit tor planting, this tact being known to the local Experiment Station, and in order to bring this fact to the notice of the farmers of the county, one pound samples of planting cotton seed were ob tained from ten good cotton tarmers, men who took some care in selecting their seed. One hundred seeds trom each sample were taken and tested tor their germination qualities and the following valuable', intormation was seured.

ought to know better than any one when the road does need working, and it is then his duty to warn out as many hands as he needs to work the cousse, keeping a working, of weltare of the hands who are torced to work the same, and at a time when it would be aking them away from im portant work on the tarm, it they be tarmers. There are
lots of places on the various roads that now need working, and the over-seers should
warn out the hands and work these bad places at once. m sure that no one wants to his road, and I do not want to indict any one, but some bad places must be fixed and fixed right at once. It is the duty of every good citizen to
see that the laws are entorced and I will thank any citizen 0 let me know when there is bad place in his road and I is worked or else the over-seer prosecuted for not working the same. Over seers please
take notice.
