To help local enthusiast prepare for the approaching season, a Second White-Tailed Deer Seminar has been set for Thursday, October 22, 1998 at the Baird Activity Center located at 208 Walnut in Baird. Registration begins at 6:30 p.m. The program begins at 7:00 p.m. Once again many door prizes will be given away with a 100 pound deer feeder and timer being given away as the Grand Door Prize. 

THE IMPORTANCE of the word "FOR" cannot be over-emphasized in certain instances--and it appears that some may be overlooking some of the rules of the election laws. According to the Texas Ethics Commission on Misrepresentation of Office Title:

"A candidate may not represent that he or she holds an office that he or she does not hold at the time of the representation. If you are not the incumbent in the office you are seeking, you must make it clear that you are seeking election rather than re-election by using the word 'for' to clarify that you don't hold that office. For example, a non-incumbent may use the following formats:

Vote John Doe for Attorney General, or John Doe for Attorney General; not Vote for John Doe Attorney General.



ON THE placement of political road signs, the Commission rules are also very explicit: 1. When is the "right-of-way" notice required? Written political advertising that is meant to be seen from a road must carry a "right-of-way" notice in the following circumstances: 1. if you enter into a contract or agreement to print or make written political advertising meant to be seen from a road; or 2. if you instruct another person to place the written political advertising meant to be seen from a road. The right of way notice reads: NOTICE: IT IS A VIOLATION OF STATE LAW (CHAPTERS 392 AND 393, TRANSPORTATION CODE) TO PLACE THIS SIGN IN THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF A HIGHWAY. Do yard signs have to have the right-of-way notice? Yes, but not bumper stickers, but bumper stickers do have to have political advertising disclosure statements. Where may I place my signs: Answer: "Check with your city or county government or with the Texas Department of Transportation." It does get technical.







Navy Petty Officer 2nd Class David M. Foster, son of Guy D. and Deborah A. Foster of Clyde, Texas, recently participated in the deactivation ceremony for the guided missile cruiser USS South Carolina.

Foster's ship made its final port visit, after completing a six-week counter-drug operation in the Caribbean, in the state that officially adopted it as the state's flagship in 1988. During the four day visit to Charleston, SC, more than 6,000 South Carolina citizens toured their namesake ship. On the eve of its departure, Gov. David Beasley gave a farewell speech honoring the ship's great service to our country.

USS South Carolina was commissioned in 1975 and conducted its first deployment in 1977 to Mediterranean Sea. Foster's ship made its 12th and final deployment, also to the Mediterranean Sea, in April 1998 before completing the drug operation in August.

During Foster's ship's 23 year history in escorting aircraft carriers or rescuing stranded Sailors at sea, in defending freedom overseas in the Cold War or waging war on drugs in the Caribbean, USS South Carolina was always prepared to deliver for its country.

USS South Carolina was deactivated on September 4, 1998.

U.S. Census Bureau Is Hiring CTO Executive Director Hired In Callahan County; Field Workers and Office Clerks

The U.S. Census Bureau is gearing up now for Census 2000 by updating its maps address lists in counties and communities throughout the state. Locally the Census is looking for people who can work at least 20 hours a week. The hours are flexible, and some of the work can be done on weekends and during evenings.

Census field workers drive through communities and rural areas. even walking street by street, to check the accuracy of Census Bureau maps and addresses. They get reimbursed \$.31 a mile for using their car. The census clerks handle a variety of standard office tasks, like answering phones, filing documents, and managing supplies.

"We're looking for people who are out of work, who are retired, or who want to schedule census work around their current employment," explains census spokesman Frank Newton. "The hours are flexible and the pay is very good."

In Callahan County, the Census pay for field workers is \$6.75 per hour and for office clerks the pay is \$5.50 per hour.

To qualify for census work, applicants must be a U.S. citizen and be 18 years old (or 16 and have a high school diploma or GED).
