The break between Huerta and his War Minister came with the discovery of an alleged plot against the provisional President on Saturday. Almost beside himselt with rage when he discovered that his subordinates were in league against him, Huerta hurried to the Belem penitentiary, where 100 political prisoners were confined, and ordered their execution. He told the jailer to lead the 100 suspected of connection with the plot outside, and to and shoot them.
The Minister went post haste to the penitentiary in an automobile. He called Huerta outside and then ordered the prisoners returned their cells.

Vera Cruz, May 26.-Wit the constitutionalist army ot more than 100,000 men pre daring tor a hurried attack on Mexico City Dictator Huera's Dictator Huerta's cabinet nembers of the Mexican senate and chamber of depaties, together with many other of the dictator's sup porters, are preparing to flee from the capital. The belie that Huerta himselt has completed arrangements to fly when the situation gets critical is becoming stronger here The report that there likely will be a general exodus ot officials of the de facto govern ment from Mexico City with in the next tew days is
strengthened by the tales told by all refugees arriving here. Practically all Americans now are out of the territory controlled by Huerta but many other foreign re idents are arriving here.

ADDRESS BY R. C. MONK, PRES DENT OF SCHOOL BOARD,

Review Progeses of Schoos ior the Past 14 Years Maks R Recommendation tor the future.

The most interesting program in the history of the Nacognoches High school commencement exerciees, was rendered Tuesday night at the auditorium.
Among, the interesting feat ures of the occasion was the address of R. C. Monk, president of the board of trustees. He said in part
"Some one has said tha 'we are all creatures of cir
cumstances'. I'm not admit cumstances'. I'm not admit
ting it neither am I denying it. Whether it is true or not as a general proposition. know right well that I'm a victim of circumstances tonight tor when through the wis chosen as chairman. they told me that I must give some intormation to the pa-
trons as we felt proud of trons as we felt proud of complished. One of the board suggested that I make "bragadocio" speech." I'm going to recount some o the things that we as a school community have accomplished since the awakening about
the year 1900 . Before,that time our schools had gotten in a bad way.
There was not sufficient funds in the first place, and in the second place, there was not the co-operation of patrons to insure good schools. We had troublesome times in these days getting out of the wilder ness, but we got out and have been making progress ever since. Many of you recal how atter voting a bond issue of $\$ 32,500$ in July 1902 and
because of the laws governing because of the laws governing towns and cities we could not get the ibonds approved and we were forced to abolish our city corporation, after which dependent district and in Jan. 1903 bonds were voted and approved to the amount of $\$ 36,500$, all of which was used to construct the building we are in tonight besides two district.
