





In pursuance of such plot that convention was packed against him by the lavish issuance of fiee passes over ratiroads to all who would go there, either as delegates or clackers, to engage in the work of overwhelming him. Speakers of great ability were selected by the combine, with reterences both to their powers and their personal dislike and bitterness toward Governor Hogg. The leading speaker thus selected was Thomas H. Ball of Houston. So well was the work don

to give back in kind the vengeance of the people. His superb courage and just indignation simply awed the whole assembly into silence. and he then went on and made the greatest speech of his lite-arguing the legal questions connected with his amendments with unsurpassed ability, and warning the convention that they were demanded by the people, and that if they were not made a part of the platform every delegate who voted against them would be branded as a traitor. He won. At the close of the debate the convention by a large majority adopted his amendment as a platform demand, and the Democrats of Texas rejoiced in this step toward conquest over the corporations and trusts .- John M.
