## More Plague Infected Rats At New Orleans

New Orleans, July 28.Bacteriologists examining rats caught last week in the fight against bubonic plague in this city, today found five rodents infected with the disease according to
Dr. W. C. Kacker, assis: tant surgeon general supervis ing plague work here. This is the largest number reported during any day since the first case developed June 27, and brings the total to 10 rodent cases. Ail of the rodents reported today were taken from the French quar
ter.
