More Plague Infected Rats At New

New Orleans, July 28 .-Bacteriologists examining rats caught last week in the fight against bubonic plague in this city, today found five rodents intected with the disease according to Dr. W. C. Rucker, assis: tant surgeon general supervising plague work here. This is the largest number reported during any day since the first case developed June 27. and brings the total to 19 rodent cases. All of the rodents reported today were taken from the French quar-


