Washington, July 29 -General Carranz and Pro visional President Carbojal have agreed on a basis tor the arrangement of peace in Mexico, according to a message received here today by Jose Castell, to personal rep resentative of Carbajal.

Mr. Castellot showed Secretary Bryan his latest advices from Mexico City. which stated . that General Villa and Sustice Allendel Carbajai's two delegates to Carranza, have been instructed to carry out in detail the gen eral basis of peace "already agreed upon.'
