Selt of Cushing, members of the Jefferson presbytery of the Presbyterian Church, United States America, were in Beaumont vesterday on their return to their homes after having held a business meeting of the synod in New Orieans, regarding the recent transfer of Rev. J. C. Barr, D. D., pastor of the Lafavette church of New Orleans, from the New Orleans presbytery of the U. S., or Southern Presbyterian church to the Jefferson Presbytery of the U.S. A., the Northern church, and the organism. 
