## To Mark The Original Old Nacogleche

 and San Autonio Read．There is an energetic and plausible move on toot to mark the oldest and most im portant road in Texas，which extends from Natchitoches La．on Red River just 100 miles east of Nacogdoches，Tex and across the state trom east to west，via San Antonio to Laredo on the Rio Grande．It is often stvled Camino del Rey，literally Road of the King．This name is often misused．In olden times any public road was called the King＇s highwav．This road was styled＂Real＂or principal road．Hence these terms as applied to it．
In pioneer days，from about the year 1800，and earlier，it was about the only big road in Texas，and when any one in＂the States＂went to Texas the distinction was along this road．
In starting out from the old French town of Natchito－ ches，it was only about fitteen miles to the next point where with an lndian settlement creek called Hondo．This often figured，but it never be came a town of importance． 1848，had a camp which was known as Fort Jessup and may have been there long be tore．

The next point on the old road was near San Augustine and then came Nacogdoches was considered in Texas ued westward via where Doug－ lass now is，and near which the geographical name＂Tejas was first heard，crossing the Angelina river at Linnwood and passing Indian villages in one being the Tejas Indians near the big mounds，west Alto on the Neches river．
