"Will you be prepared to furnish ninety-eight white men on movement from September nineteen to twenty-third? If not why not?"

This will be the next forty per cent of the quota for Nacogdoches county, and if the Board gets its certified list back in time, it will endeavor to get the men ready for the call.

To make this last statement better understood, The Sentinel will explain that the Board was required to send its list to headquarters where they will be examined and certified to, which puts every name contained on it into service subject to the conditions of call and examination. These lists have not yet been retunrned, but the Board is looking for them in every mail, and the minute they are received a list of names will be made up with which to supply these ninetyeight white men-
