TREATMENT OF THE SWEET POTATO ROTS (By Plant Páthologist, State Department of Agriculture, Austin, Texas.)
There are numerous diseases There is no one sweet method of keeping these diseases in control,
because we find them attacking the potato in the seed bed, in the ferd and in storage. The black he same treatments practically hold true for them ail.
First of all we must be sure of our secd and our see bed. Se-
lect good, sound, healthy seed, lect good, sound, healthy seed,
and to guard against possible inand to guard against possible in-
fection immerse them for 10 to rection immerse them for 10 to
15 minutes in 8 or 10 gallons of water containing 1 oz . of formaldehyde. A formaldehyde solutant for the seed bed, 1 pint of tant for the seed bed, 1 pint of
formaldehyde to $20^{-}$gallons of water being the proper cilution water being the proper cilution.
Use this at the rate of one gallon per square foot of the seed bed. Cover the seed bed for 12 hours with canvas in order that the formaldehyde fumes will soil.
The black rot as well as other potato diseases may easily be carried over from one year to another in the field. The infecting agents or germs will live on potato roots and in the soil itself, bosides causing infection to allied plants of the sweet potato, such as the wild morning glory. bed prove of very little value when the field, where the slipe are to be planted, has produced an abundance of diseased potatoes year after year.
Successive planting on the same land year after year will almost always yiehd diseased potatoes. Rotation in growing sweet potatoes is therefore ne-
cessary. Keeping the potatoes i- healthy in storage is another ture of 85 to 90 degrees Fahrenof black rot, and is sound keeping of potatoes in the storage house. A fluctuating

Before storing the poinfected tubers, as ose that are bruised should be separated sound and healthy
