



THE LIMIT FOR TEXAS

The federal food administration for Texas, because of the shortage of wheat flour, has placed the individual on a flour allowance of six pounds every 30 days, the distribution and responsibility for an equitable distribution being placed with the retailer. The statement on the need for insti-tuting a flour allowance in Texas, is as follows:

On account of the flour situation throughout Texas caused mainly by transportation difficulties, the following program should be followed to the letter, by retailers selling to the con-

Retailers are permitted to sell consumers a 30-day supply of flour, basing such sales on an allowance of six pounds per person per month, provided said six pounds is not in excess of 70 per cent of consumers' normal re-


