Stockmen in this country are about the last holdouts against government subsidies and from here, it looks as if they are
being punished soundly because of it. We heard of one woman who said in an interview that she just
didn't have enough money to get by on every month. Her husband gives her $\$ 1000$ a month for houshehold expenses, but
she has over $\$ 800$ set payments. Poor thin! She probably has every household convenience money can buy, plus the mont dy payments on each one of them, two or
three cars in the driveway, belongs to the country club and probably has a summer cottage somewhere to boot.
But she doesn't have enough money to buy Someone has remarked that if she could buy meat on her cr
card, she probably wouldn't care how much it costs. Consider these facts as they relate to farm prices before
blaming the farmer for the high costs of fodblaming the farmer for the high costs of food-
Farm prices for food are up only six per cent from 20 years
ago. ago.
The farmer gets only 40 cents out of each dollar spent on
food, the rest goes for transportation, processing, packaging and marketing.
During the last quarte of 1972 , the average American family
spent only 15.8 per cent of his income after taxes for food. Even spent ony y 15.8 per cent of his income after taxes for food. Even
with the increases in early 1973 , the level is about 16 per cent. Compare this with 23 per cent 20 years ago.
Farm production costs have more than doubled in the past 20
years, hired help is up two and a half times higher than 20 years
ago while farm machinery has more than doubled. Average wage rates per hour of non-farm. production
workers are more than two and a half times higher than 20 years ago. In 1950, non-farm workersavereaged ${ }^{\text {sigher than } 20}$
in 1972 per hour; they averaged $\$ 3.65$ per hour; in 1973, it was up to While retail. food prices went up 33 per cent from 1965
through 1922, per capita income was increasing 62 per cent. Since 1950 , if prices received by farmers for cattle had risen
