



"It has been agreed that the wheat bread of the allies shall contain twenty (20) per-cent other grains than wheat, and it is only just that we should bear our share in this saving and our bread should be at least universal with those who are suffering more greatly from the war than ourselve





"2" In regulations covering the case, where straight wheat flour is sold by retailers, that at the same time 20 per cent of other cereal flours must be sold coincidentally. "3. Requiring that all bakers' bread shall contain 20 per cent of other

cereals; and the Food Administration relies upon the householders of the country to mix at least 20 per cent of the substitute cereals into the wheat flour at home for all uses. Corn meal for use of corn bread

should be purchased separately from combination sales.

Ready Mixed Flour for Sale.

"It is desired to insure a supply of ready mixed flours on the market and to have millers and dealers of all kinds encourage use and sale of this flour. so that the country may be on a mixed flour basis without necessity of the retailers making combination sales of flours and substitutes.

"All such mixed flours made according to the following regulations should be labeled 'Victory Mixed Flour,' and 3:00 p. m .- Enlistment of are to be labeled with the ingredients in order of their proportion. The flours so mixed must be milled in accordance with the standards of the United States Food Administration. "No mixed flours, except pancake flours, shall be made or manufactured except in the exact proportions as outlined below. Mixed wheat and barley flour shall be in proportion of four pounds of wheat flour to one found of parley flour. Mixed wheat and corn flour shall contain the proportion of four pounds of wheat flour to one pound of corn flour. Mixed wheat, barley and corn flour shall contain the proportions of eight pounds of wheat flour to one pound of barley and one pound of corn flour. Mixed wheat and rye flour shall contain the proportions of three pounds of wheat flour and not less than two pounds of rye flour. Whole wheat, entire wheat r graham flour or meal shall contain "All the above 'victory mixed flours' may be sold without substitutes, but

wholesale and retail dealer than in the case of standard wheat flour. Retail Sale of Standard Wheat Flour.

"The new regulations supersede the fifty-fifty rule. The retail dealer sellard wheat flour is required to carry in stock either barley flour, corn eal or corn flour, and with every sale of wheat flour must sell a combination f some one or more of these in the aroportion of one pound substitutes to ach four pounds of wheat flour.

'No dealer may force any other subtutes in comb ation upon the conimer and the substitutes must conm to the standards fixed by the Inited States Food Administration. "There are some localities where other substitutes are available and which retailers may wish to carry. In order to meet this situation the fol-lowing flours may be sold in such com-binations in lieu of the above flours

To Make Fruit Drinks.


The principal charm of a fruit drink ies in the smooth blending of the various flavors. When ready to use supply the needed sugar in the form of a syrup, for otherwise the juices and sugar must be mixed and allowed to stand together for several hours before serving. A sugar syrup may be omitted and in place of each cup omited. 1 cup of honey or 1% cups of white corn syrup. It saves time and fuel to make a quart or so of this syrup at a time and bottle it boiling hot in sterilized jars for subsequent

A small amount of some strongly acid juice should always be added to the fruit drink to give it the proper degree of acidity. The juice of rhubarb or barberries is sufficiently sour to take the place of lemon juice, which is often recommended for this purpose. Orange juice may be substituted POUNDS OF SUGAR A MONTH? for lemon juice by adding to it a small quality of cider vinegar.

Add to the fruit juices enough of the syrup to sweeten them, enough acid juice to contribute the desired zest, and dilute the whole to taste with shaved ice or with ice water.

To Make Fruit Leathers.

Concentrate fruit julces by boiling them over direct heat, then by drying them in the top of a double boiler, or on platters or enamel pans set in a moderate oven. The juice is sufficiently concentrated when, on cooling. it makes a highly glazed, tough, dry, leathery jelly. Dry the leather in thin sheets, and roll the sheets like jelly rolls, then cut them across; or dry it in a sheet % of an inch thick, and cut it in cubes. In either of these forms the leather makes a tempting confection. Store in air-tight containers or in a dry place. Leathers are also made from un

SGT. CLAUD BARHAM'S LOCATION IS KNOWN

The casualty list appearing in American papers today reports Sergeant Claud M. Barham of Nacogdoches "mising in action," but the gallant young soldier is in a French hospital recovering from an acidental injury to his nkle contracted while engaged in service.

On July 21st Dr. George S Barham of this city received a message from the war department advising that a cablegram had been received announcing that Sergeant Claude S. Barham was missing in action. On July 25th, four days later, Dr. Barham received a letter from the young man announcing that he was in a French hospital in Touluse, France, with an injured ankle.
