## **BRITISH AMERICANS** CONTNUED PROGRESS

(By Associated Press)

WITH THE ANGLO-AMERI-CANS AT ST. QUENTIN, Oct. 9.—Heavy fighting continued throughout the night in the Cambrai-St. Quentin front, and the British and Americans continued to progress under the protection of a heavy fire from the British artillery.

The defeated enemy was almost smothered under a great deluge of steel and explosives. A. larg number, of German guns have been captured by the British and Americans in addition to the great batch of prisoners. which confinue arriving at Canes.

The American troops alone captured two complete field batteries and heavy artillery: German reinforcements have arrived, but as these troops have been engaged several times recently. their presence merley adds to the confusion in the enemy ranks,




