Austria must evacuate all invaded territory, leaving behind all equipment and supplies. including coal. A surrender of a portion of the Austrian surface. submarine fleets disarmed, and other p under American and allied control, is included in the terms.
Austria must surrender all Gierman submarines in Austrian
orts. Free navigation of Austrian-waters by war and commeral fleets must be made available. All air craft must be put out German troops in tustria-Hungars. Haly or

The allied blockade against Austria remains unchanged. ners without reciprocity.
