## Crim Predicts Another Good Harvest Season

 This is the second year inhat winds foretell a good year. On March 22 each year in the community of Lazbuddie, the
direction of the wind is direction of the wind is very
important. This is the day Weldon "Indian" Crim makes his annual spring forecast.
The 'fire burning' is a vital ritual taken from an old Indian tradition in
which the wind actually predicts the which the wind actually predicts the
weather on sunrise March 22 which is traditionally the first day after the start of Spring.
A teepee-type shape is made of any kind of wood and gasoline is poured on the wood for burning. As soon as the sun peeks above the
horizon the fire is lit and it depends on the direction the wind blows as to how the crop year is determined,
successfur successful or not successful.
This is the second year in a row
hat a good year has been predicte A bumper crop and above norma moisture is in the forecast. The
season will also season will also bring on
thunderstorms and some hail This year the wind was the northeast and blew toward the southwest which predicts a "good" year for area farmers.
A good year is needed for the
area because the last such prediction came in 1984. The following five years were forecast "fair" to "poor range. The predicitons have been 80 to 90 percent correct. This ritual began in the Crim

## Fresh Asparagus Can Be Cooked

## And Served In Many Variations

 Saturday was the first day ofpring, and although the weather Spring, and although the weather
has been fler, cover and cook on high for
$5-10$ minutes, until the thicker end Summer-like heat and Winter-like frost, the signs that Spring is really here abound.
The robin
The robins are hopping happily
about the yard, the wild geese have about the yard, the wild geese have
flown back home, the ducks are making nests, and our cats can't wait to run outside and roll in the dirt. One sure sign of Spring isn't One sure sign of Spring isn't
outside, though. It's in the supoutside, though. It's in the sup-
ermarket--fresh asparagus. While canned asparagus is always available, it just doessn't compare to
the fresh stalks available in Spring the fresh stalks available in Spring
and sometimes early Summer and sometimes early Summer.
When buying fresh asparagus, look for straight stalks with compact tips and good green color.
To prepare fresh asparagus, To prepare fresh asparagus, tough end that is break off the tough end that is too tough to eat.
Rinse the stalks under cool water to remore any grit that has collected in the tip and scales; trim the scales with a knife, if desired.
cooked in asparagus can be cooked in a saucepan, in the
microwave, or it can be seamed microwave, or it can be steamed or
stir-fried. To cook asparagus on the stovetop, cook the stalks in $1 / 2$ inch of salted water in a large
