Baird Schools Introduce New Educational Program for Year

BAIRD — The Baird Independent Schools are beginning a new program this year, which will provide services to meet the needs of children with learning disabilities. The pupils are screened and approved for eligibility before being placed in the program.

Pupils may come from their regular classroom to the resource teacher as necessary for special instruction, but they will spend most of their school day in their regular classroom.

These services are provided as part of the Taylor-Callahan Special Education Co-Operative which is supervised by Leon Walker of Merkel. Mrs. Gay

Perkins is the resource teacher for Baird, and Mrs. Janece Tucker is the educational aide.

The Baird Schools also have available the services of an educational diagnostician, speech therapist and visiting teacher part time as needed.

Old Highway 80 Through Baird To Receive New Asphalt Topping

BAIRD — According to Texas Highway Department officials, work is scheduled to begin Aug. 22 or 23 on Loop 425 (old U. S. 80) through Baird. The project will extend from the business route exit west of Baird to the entrance ramp onto IH 20 on the east side of Baird. Total length of the project is approximately 2.8 miles with a contract price of \$45,967.95.

The project will consist of and approximate one inch hot mix overlay with a seal coat on the shoulders where they exist. The hot mix overlay, which is identical to the riding surface now being placed on IH 20, will provide a much smoother ride and will reduce the possibility of skidding during wet pavement

Baird Enrollment Tuesday at 385

BAIRD — Supt. Bill Gunn announced Tuesday that the schools had enrolled 385 students, nine over last year. There are 36 seniors, 32 juniors, 34 sophomores and 37 freshmen, totaling 139 students.

The 8th grade in Junior High reported the largest number in a class, with 37; 7th grade 27; 6th grade 33; 5th grade, 32; 4th grade, 34; 3rd grade, 35; 2nd grade 28 and 1st grade 20. This totals 246 in Junior High and grade school.

Classes at school began Monday morning, Aug. 20, with students finding it hard to get back on schedule. But assured that after a fashion, things would begin to pick up when the Bears take to the field on Sept. 7th.

SOIL SURVEY NOW IN PROGRESS IN COUNTY

BAIRD — The Soil Conservation Service is presently in the process of making a soil survey of Callahan County. David Kelly, Area Soil Scientist, stationed at Brownwood, is in charge of the survey. He is assisted by Buford Haley, Soil Scientist, stationed in Baird.

According to Haley, the soil survey will provide information that can be applied in farm and ranch management; in site selection for roads, ponds, buildings and other structures; and in judging the suitability of soils for agricultural, industrial or recreational uses.

All the soils in the county are named and will be shown on maps made from aerial photographs. The different soil areas will be outlined on the maps an identified by symbols. The same soils found in different part of the county will have the same symbol and a descriptive legend showing the name of the soil, the percent of slope, and the amount of erosion present for each soil area.

Farmers and ranchers have been familiar with soil maps for years and find them useful in making management decisions on their lands. Haley pointed out that engineers, developers, and builders are finding soil surveys very valuable. The soil survey will contain information concerning individual soil features affecting the building of roads, bridges, dams and pipe lines. Builders and contractors will be able to use the soil survey to determine the suitability of certain soils for building foundations, locating filter fields for septic tanks, to determine the effect a soil will have on the corrosion of pipes, and even to locate sources of topsoil, sand, gravel, and other building materials.

The Callahan County survey is 60% complete at the present time. Haley stated that field mapping should be completed by December of 1975, and will be published in book form by 1978. Once published, it will be available to all interested parties.

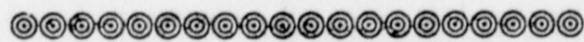

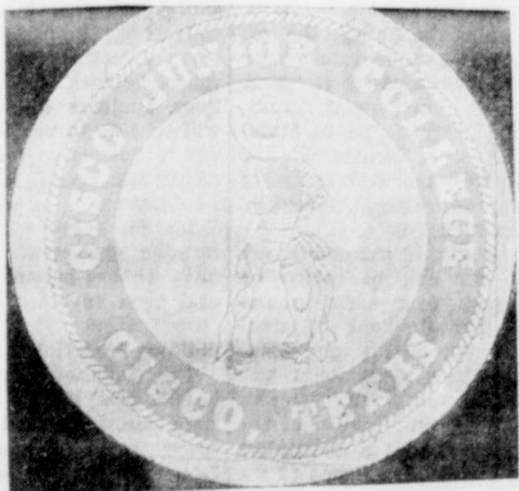

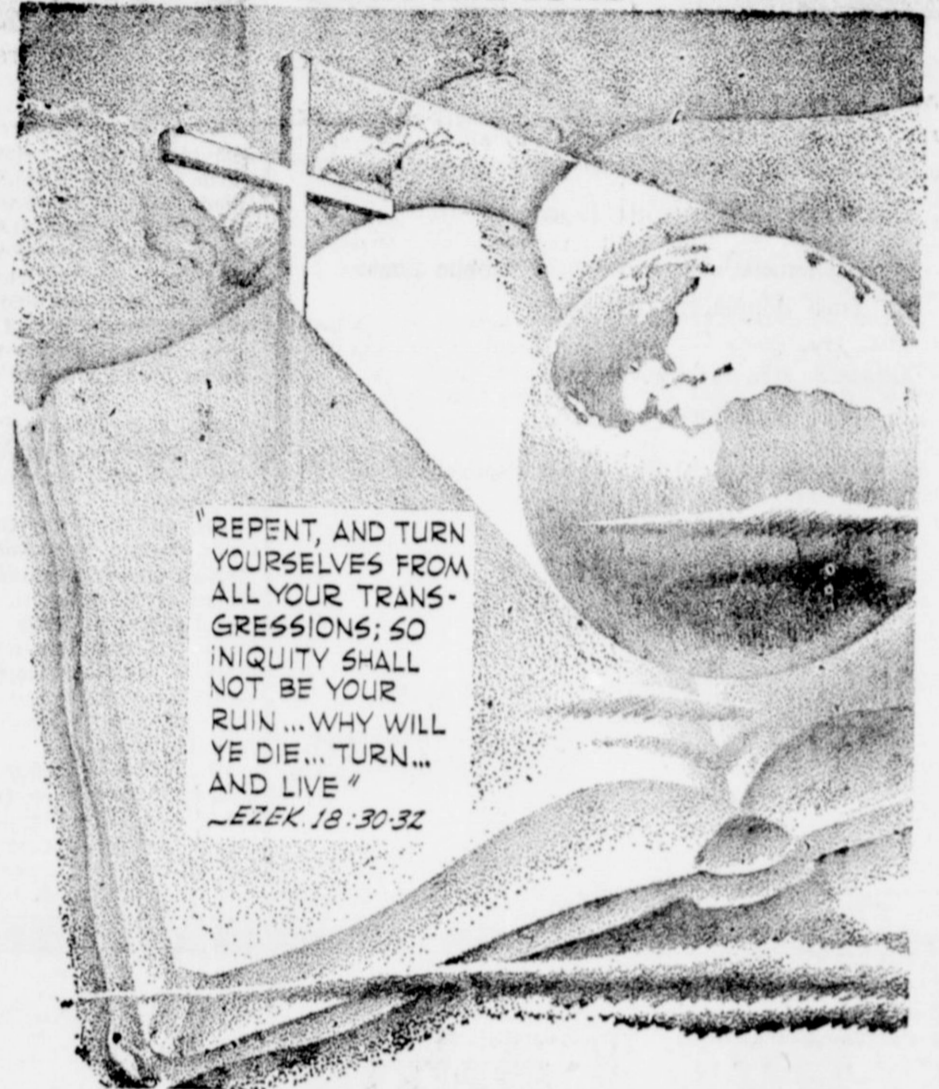
