Although the dispute may have been lamorized through the written word and made "bigger than it actually was," one report said that during the atter part of the 19th century in the area along Blackberry Creek, more had been killed or wounded.
The feud even had its rom angle, when Johnse Hatfield courted Rose Ann McCoy and the two ran away together, "living in sin." Adding insult to injury as far as the
McCoys were concerned was the fact hat later, young Hatfield abandoned Rose Anne.
At one point during the height of he feud, the two states of Kentucky and West Virginia came close to governors of the two states threatened to send out their respective militias to put down the disturbance. But the fighting finally ended, and when the patriarch of the Hatfield clan, "Devil Anse" Hatrield died in been over for at least 25 years.
But the old feud was never officially laid to rest until a public ceremony in 1976, when the oldest
members of the two clans, Willis members of the two clans, Willis
Hatfield, 88 , and Jimmy McCoy, 91 , meeting on Blackberry Creek to dedicate a monument for six of the feud's victims, finally shook hands. This past weekend, in the

## Last Chance To File Farm Acres

If farmers failed to report their crop acreages by August 2, they can
still get it done, but a "late" charg still get it done, but a "late" charge
will be assessed, and this must be done by August 15 , according to Prentice Mills, County Executive Director of the ASCS.

You can make a late-filed acreage report provided that you pay us to
visit the farm to verify and measur the acreage. This beats not having your acreage on record," Mills says, especially if you suffered hail damage.
Mills also pointed out that if, due to adverse weather, a farmer's wheat yield in 1982 was less than 60 per cent of normal, their farm is probably eligible for disaster payment. Once
again, the acreage needs to have been again, the acreage needs to have been
reported, and if it has not been already, this needs to be done immediately.
Such wheat farmers will be given a 15-day grace period to report weathe damage, after which a late filing fee

State Comptroller Bob Bullock
Wednesday sent checks totaling $\$ 38.9$ million to 967 Texas cities as their for July.

Payment to the City of Bovina for
the period amounted to $\$ 782.12$ the period amounted to $\$ 782.12$,
which brought the total receipts for the year to $\$ 12,157.59$. This is down somewhat from the same point in 1981, when receipts totalled $\$ 15,356.02$.
"These monthly rebates, and the etail sales they represent, continue to show increases over last year,"
Bullock said. The Comptroller pointed out that for the first seven months of 1982, sales tax collections are running 14.4 per cent ahead of $\stackrel{981 .}{ } \quad$.
Houston received the biggest check, city has received during 1982 to hat city has received during 1982 to
$\$ 83.6$ million, up nearly 18 per cent over last year. Dallas got $\$ 4$ million, bringing the total received during 1982 to $\$ 42.5$ The City of San Antonio received a check for $\$ 2.2$ million, up 25.1 per cent from last July's payment of $\$ 1.7$ million.
The City of Fort Worth got $\$ 1.4$ million, compared with $\$ 1.2$ million $\$ 1.4$ million, up 40.7 per cent from last July's check for $\$ 1$ million. El Paso received a $\$ 1$ million check, up 31.3 per cent over last
