Some of World's Most Noted Auto Drivers to Thrill Spectators Two Days.

the 1921 Louisiana State Fair, which opens October 27 and runs eleven days, by participating in the two days' Automobile Racing Meet. The meet will be staged on the two Sundays of the Fair period, October 30 and November 6.
"Attractive purses have been hung up for the winners in the automobile contests, and a dozen or more of the greatest drivers in the motor racing game are expected to enter the meet. One of the feature efforts of the dare-devils whirling around the fast mile circuit will be directed towards smashing previous time record established at the Louisiana State Fair track. There are on record some marvelous achievements, and if these records are broken the successful contestants will be compelled to drive the distance in hair-raising, death-defying style. But it is maniacal speed of this sort that these kings of the track are noted for, and there's no doubt that the thousands of spectators will have all the excitement and thrills they could wish for.
Not only will some of the greatest drivers of the age be seen in action, but some of the most celebrated racing machines will be in use at the

Louisiana Fair. These cars were built especially for dirt track racing, which means speeding without any regard being given the risks that the daring drivers must take in "shooting the juice" to the limit.

Spirit of Pioneer Days in Texas Will Hover Over State Fair During the Great Centennial Celebration



One of the most interesting announcements for the season of 1921 was recently made by the officials of the State Fair of Texas in outlining a great Texas Centennial Celebration during the 1921 Fair—Dallas, October 8 to 23. This affair is going to be the most solemn historical event Texas has ever seen, yet with a full dash of the spectacular to make it worth the while of thousands of Fair visitors.
The Texas Centennial Pageant will be the formal opening fete of the Fair, and will be staged in the great Athletic Stadium on the evening of October 8. Five thousand people will take part in a picturesque pageant of pantomime and tableaux, in which costumes will be a bright feature. Brilliant decorations, wonderful lighting effects, and especially adapted music will make the Pageant complete in artistic triumph. The story of one hundred years of Anglo-American progress—of how a great state has been built on the little Stephen F. Austin colony of 1821—will be faithfully portrayed. It promises to be the most interesting production ever seen in Texas.
The State Fair of Texas has secured the services of Jack Webster Harkrider, a native Texan and nationally prominent Pageant Master to direct the Texas Centennial Pageant. The Pageant will have a distinctive social side. Mr. Harkrider is now arranging this feature. The Pageant will have a Queen, who will hold social Court for the occasion. Every city and town in Texas will send its fair representative to this Court of Honor, and foreign countries and other states and their principal cities, will do likewise.

Woman as Medal Designer.
Mme. Anie Mouroux, a French woman, is now on a visit to this country and has achieved a world wide reputation as a designer and maker of medals. She designed a number of war medals, for the French government, and has done other notable work. She was a winner of the Prix de Rome, which was established in 1693, and during all that time she was the only woman who contested for the honor. When she was selected the award narrowed itself down to a group of six.
