By the way, guys, if you haven't checked it out, Parmer County is just below Deaf Smith County. We're not sure whether Parmer County is in the Panhandle or on the South Plains. Maybe not either one.

Back to the geography lesson: With the state's Sesquicentennial just around the corner, you announcers might need to be aware that San Antonio's home county is Bexar. Not pronounced Bex-ar, though. It's like the aspirin: Bayer.

If you watched the John Wayne movie, "The Alamo," then you might have caught this. Or, you may just have wondered where the town of Bayer, I mean Bexar, was located.

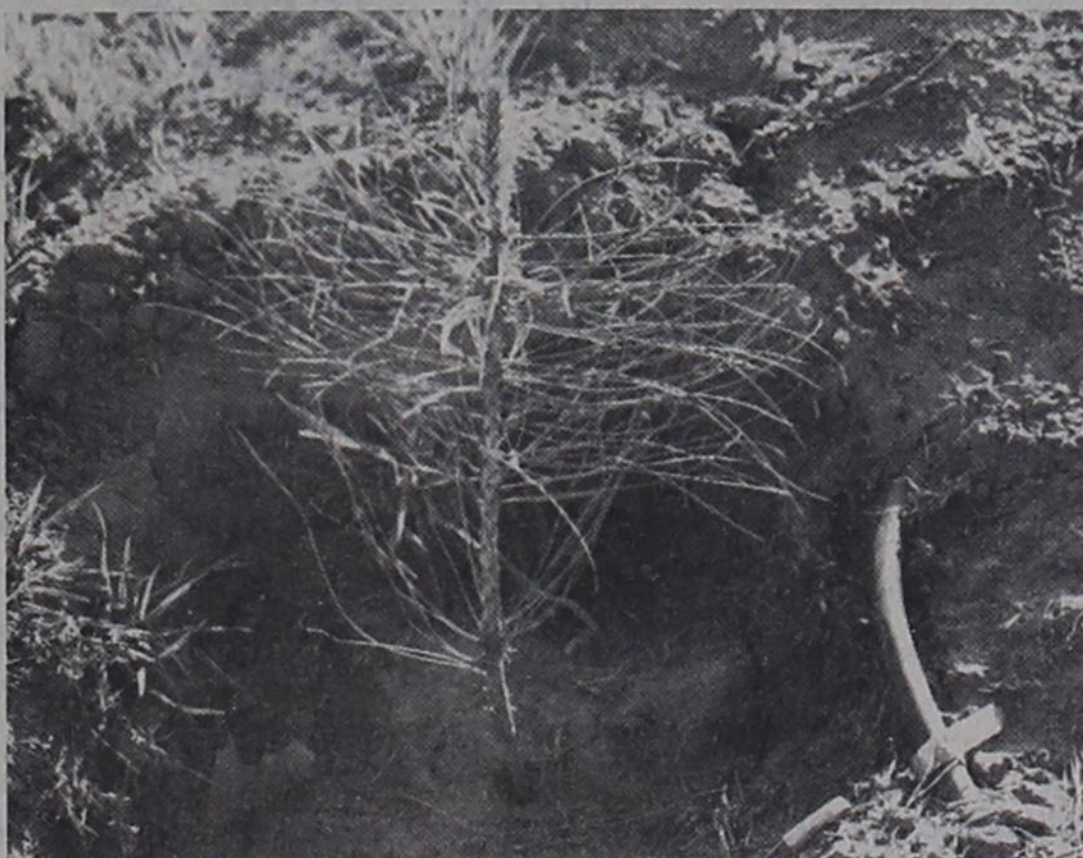
The program will inform citizens on how to protect their children by photographs, finger prints and so forth.

Bradshaw Calls Job Rewarding

"I had no idea the job would be this challenging and rewarding," John Bradshaw said as he talked about his first ninety days as the Regional Crime Prevention Officer for the Panhandle. Bradshaw, a former Secret Service Agent and international currency expert, has travelled about 1000 miles a month, working with law enforcement officers and community groups.

"So far," he said, "I've talked to all but one sheriff and one police chief in the Panhandle area. I am reassured about the high level of professionalism among all these men and women."

Bradshaw has had a particularly warm welcome in Parmer County. Bovina Police Chief Pete Hernandez asked me to help some of the people in Bovina with a Neighborhood Watch Program," he said. "I didn't know what to expect. Sometimes it's a problem to get community interest in this kind of program."

Bradshaw certainly didn't expect to come back to Bovina four times in as many months and make presentations to overflow crowds each time.

"The people of Bovina and Parmer County are really interested in the Neighborhood Watch concept," he said. "We already have Bovina organized into 12 neighborhood watch sections of four to ten blocks each."

He entered the Armed Forces in 1974 and received an honorable discharge in 1977.

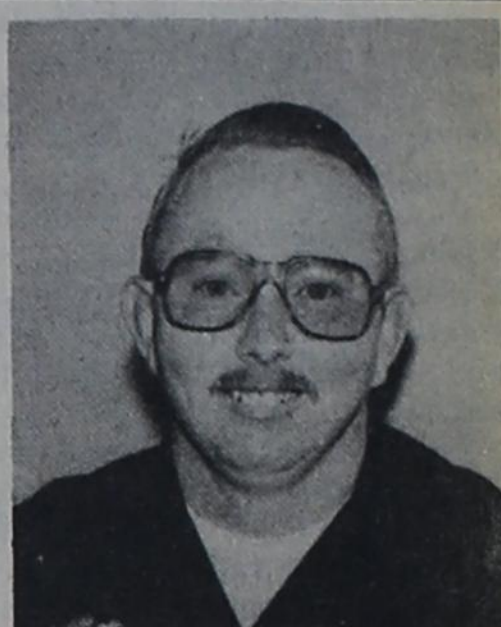
He has his State License for Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.

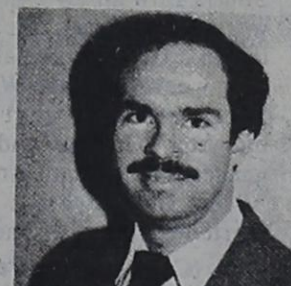

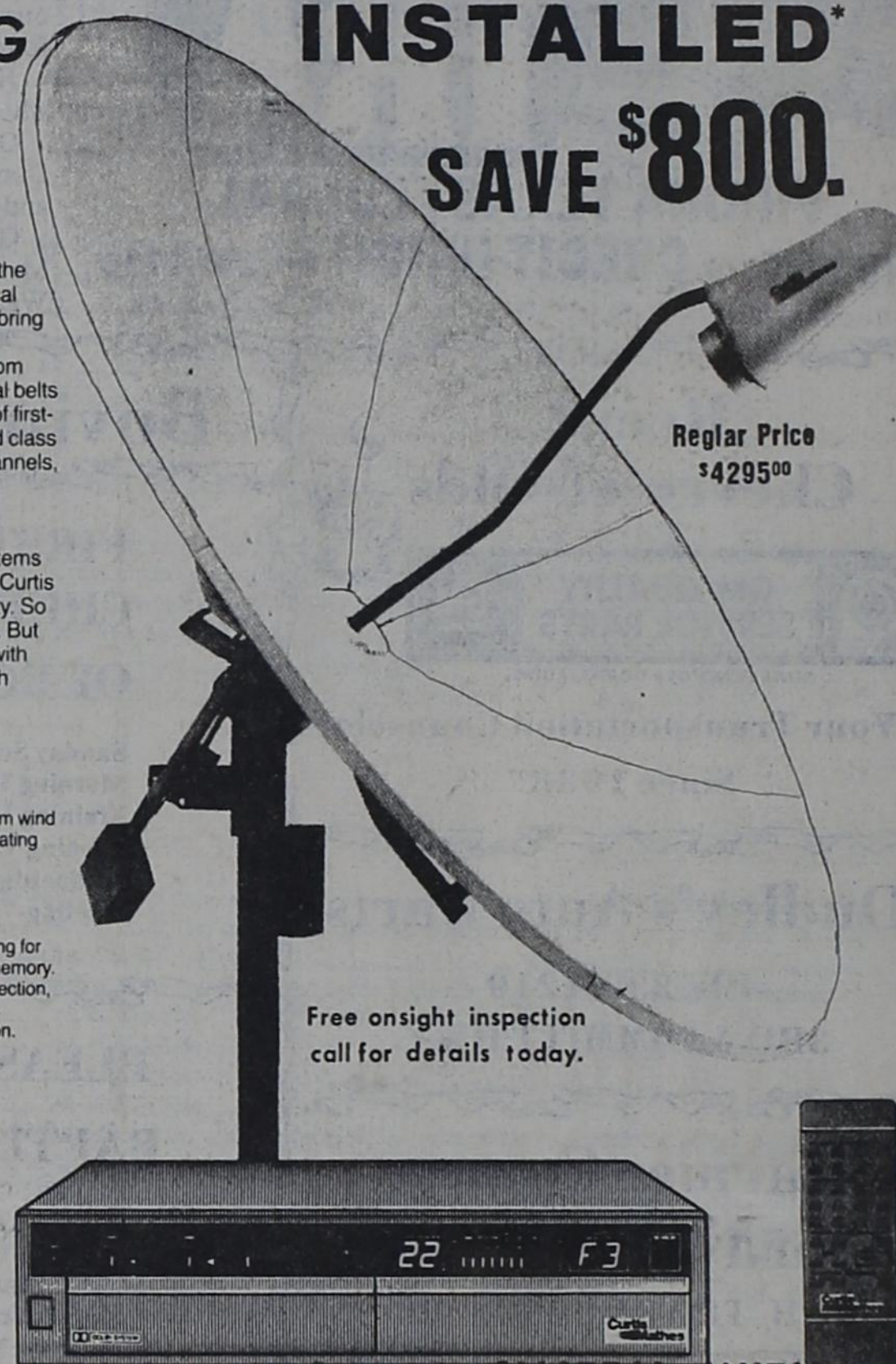

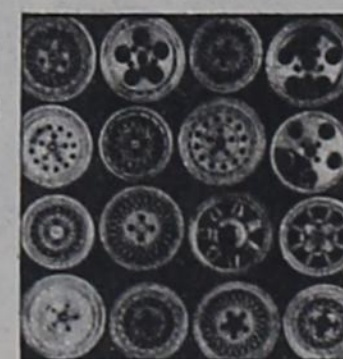

Plans to have Trade Days is once again scheduled for the third weekends. We'll let you know more about it later on, when we have more information.

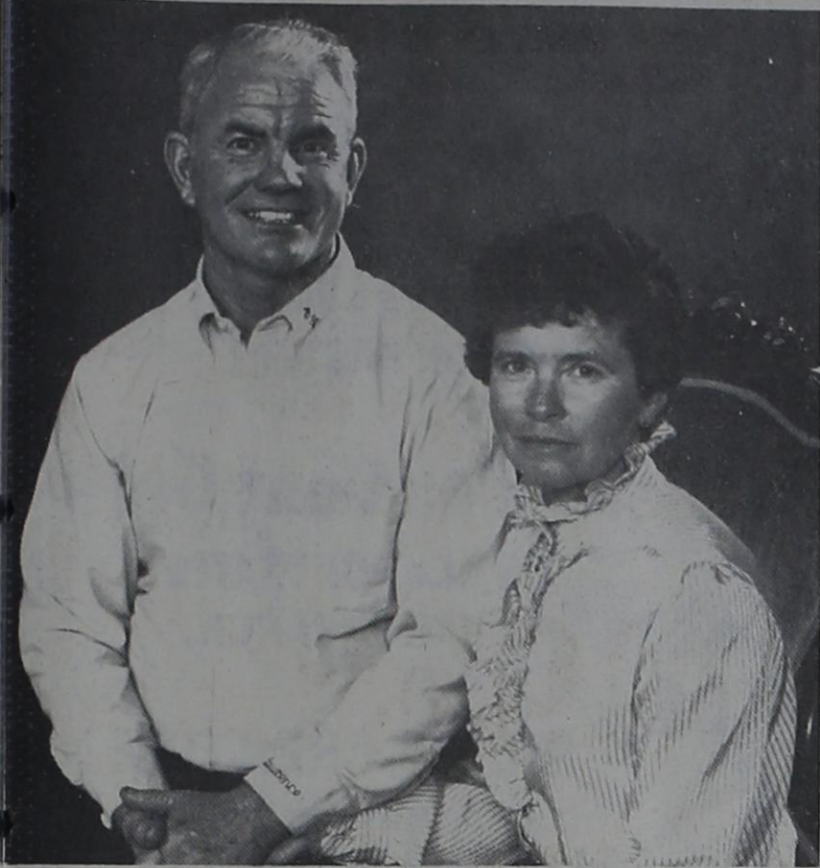
Bethal Wilcox is still in Clovis with her daughter, Ruby McCormick, and is getting along real well.
