wells in the past four years indicate the largest rate of decline since the early 1980 s.
Some irrigators may run out of money before they run out of water i they do not become more efficient in the production and distribution of irrigation water. Many irrigators are using pumping plants that are worn out or incorrectly sized for the amount of water they are pumping. This coupled with water lost during irrigation system application--sometimes as
much as 40 per cent--will likely result in many farmers having to abandon irrigation.
Now is a good time to do a self evaluation of your irrigation system, specially if you have difficulty meeting crop water needs. The first step i idenuty where water losses are occurring and decide what type of system upgrade would help eliminate water losses. The tables below will help you
