




Important Cottonseed Payments Will Help Local Cotton Farmers

Rep. Larry Combest (R-TX) is pleased to announce that the U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced plans to release approximately \$74 million in funding to help farmers and ginners offset losses from last year's low cottonseed prices.

The payment proposal was included in the final spending bill passed by Congress last October which gave the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, Dan Glickman, special authority to provide financial assistance to producers or first-handlers of the 1999 cottonseed crop. Cottonseed prices plummeted last year due to the excessive supply of worldwide oilseeds, causing many producers to suffer costly ginning charges.

"The cottonseed assistance is good news for the cotton industry. These payments, coupled with the nearly \$9 billion that Congress appropriated for agriculture funding last year, will certainly help West Texas farm community that is currently facing a serious financial crisis," Combest stated.


The payment rate is expected to be around \$11.40 per ton of cottonseed, which is based on USDA's current estimate of 6.5 million tons of cottonseed. Regulations for the new program must be published in the Federal Register before any payments can be made. The program will be implemented by the Farm Service Agency.
