

Cooking has always been a pleasure to her and she has a large collection of recipes, some of them very old.


One of her favorites, which she has used for many many years is:

Custard Pie 1 unbaked pie shell 4 slightly beaten eggs

1/4 tsp. salt 1/2 cup sugar ½ tsp. vanilla ½ tsp. nutmeg 21/2 cups scalded milk

Blend eggs, sugar and vanilla. Add other ingredients and mix well. Slowly stir in hot milk. Bake 25-30 minutes at 425°. Reduce heat to 325° and bake about fifteen minutes longer.
