What businesses support our schools? Our organizations? Our churches? And who hires our sons and daughters and nieces and nephews? Local places.

We have had a record of successful school programs. And successful social activities. Why? Because we work together.

By spending our money locally, it means that those dollars are being recycled into the salaries of local folks and into contributions to local projects. That's called "working together."

This is to apply with the new tax law, that children five years and older must have Social Security numbers, if they are declared as arrived. tax dependents of their parents.

If children do not have Social Security cards the IRS will remove the child as a tax dependent and the parents will be fined. All children can have cards, but those five years old and older must have a card.

Birth certificates or baptismal records must be brought to the school on April 23 for a SS number and they will be returned that day.

Mindy Neal, Bovina High School basketball star, has been signed to a full, five-year scholarship by Texas A&M University.


