#### **AMBULANCE** E.M.H. SAYS NO SUBIDY MEANS TERMINATION

**Emergency Medical** Services was one of the main topics at the County Commissioners Court meeting Monday.

County Judge Scott Bailey brought a letter to a Court from Eastland Memorial Hospital Administrator Marcia Carr stating that ambulance service from the hospital would end if the countycity subsidy ends Sept. 30.

Along with the letter was a copy of the proposed 1991-92 budget for basic emergency medical services. But the Commissioners were asked to take notice that the budget was based on the assumption

that subsidies would continue. "As you know," the letter continued, "Eastland County has tendered

their notice of termination under the present contract. This termination becomes effective Sept. 30, 1991...."Therefore, as Eastland Memorial Hospital will have no ambulances, please be advised that effective 12 p.m. Sept. 30, 1991 Eastland Memorial Hospital will no longer be providing Emergency Medical Services.

"If it is Eastland County's desire to have Eastland Memorial Hospital continue the Emergency Medical Service after that date, please advise us on or before Sept. 1, 1991."

She went on to say that the Hospital would be willing to provide the services under the same terms and conditions as the present contract until such time as other arrangements can be made by the city, county or both.

Included in the arrangements referred to is that two fully equipped Emergency Service vehicles are provided at no cost to Eastland Memorial Hospital to operate, charge per call would be and collision and liability \$201.

insurance is provided for the EMS at no cost to Eastland Memorial Hospital.

Subsidies on operation are provided by the City or Eastland and the county, with the county's share around \$25,000 annually. An equal Emergency Medical Service subsidy is provided to the other three Precincts in the county.

Some weeks ago the Commissioners Court stated that the county is using up its reserves and can no longer subsidize ambulances or other Emergency Services.

In discussing the letter, Comm. Richard Robinson said: "We started this, knowing we couldn't keep on forever. We were hoping they would see the value of it they are definitely mak- ROYAL NEIGHBORS MEET ing money."

The Commissioners said it might be possible to work out Emergency Medical Services with surrounding towns, with some arrangement where Cisco and Ranger Ambulances could cover Eastland.

The Emergency Medical situation is expected to be reviewed at that time. Robinson said he planned to attend, but did not indicate much hope of a solution.

The proposed Ambulance Service budget submitted by Eastland Hospital to the Commissioners estimated total expenses for 1991-92 as \$123,203 and collections at \$109,754, showing a loss of \$13,449.

The budget also estimated calls at 2.2 per day, 66.9 per month, and 803 annually. The estimated

## Sue Mobley Bentley

CISCO- Sue Mobley Bentley died at 6:30 a.m. Monday, July 8, 1991, in ICU of Medical Arts Hospital in Texarkana.

Mrs. Bentley, a native of Cisco, was the greatniece of the builder of the Mobley Hotel which was Conrad Hilton's first. She was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Mobley. She and her sister, Marcia Mobley Wilson, had cared for their widowed mother for several years. Mrs. Mobley died at Mrs. Bentley's home in Texarkana last here and her home in spring only a few months after celebrating her 98th birthday in Cisco. She was buried in Texarkana. A memorial service was conducted at the First Christian Church in Cisco on June 8. "Mom" Mobley, as many called her, had been a member of that church for 74 years.

Final rites for Mrs. Bentley were pending and were not expected to be announced until Thursday following an autopsy. She became dangerously ill on July 4 after shopping with her daughter that morning. She was carried to the hospital and put in ICU for diagnosis immediately. The doctors were still running tests when she died Monday. They suggested an autopsy.

Mrs. Bentley graduated from Cisco High School, attended Randolph College and worked for The Cisco Press during the '30s. She met her husband, Joe Bentley, while an employee of The Cisco Press. The Bentleys later bought a paper in Hooks, near Texarkana. Together, they edited and published that paper until his death.

Mrs. Bentley lived with her mother and cared for her at their home in Cisco, dividing her time between Texarkana. She carried her crippled mother to the Senior Citizens luncheons each time they met and Mrs. Bentley herself served as a volunteer there. She was a member of Cisco's First Christian Church, their women's organization and the

She is survived by a daughter and son-in-law, Sue Andrea and William Liles of Texarkana; two sisters, Mrs. Marcia Wilson of Houston and Ada Roan Necessary of Killeen; and a number of nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband, her father and mother, and her brother, Forrest Mobley.



Texas School Children Learn More About Solid Waste Issues

Garbage pizza — the idea may not do much for grown-ups, but kids love it. Some teachers already are using garbage pizza to teach children about the amount of solid waste we generate, and why the way we manage that waste is of concern to them. And more will be using it soon, thanks to the Texas Department of Health (TDH).

Through its Bureau of Solid Waste Management, TDH awarded a contract to Keep Texas Beautiful, Inc., to develop a statewide educational program on solid waste issues. **Humid Heat Can** Cause Illness

combined with high humidity, could lead to the deadly threat of heat-related illness for many Texans.

Health officials warn that heat stress, or hyperthermia, contributed to 1,700 deaths in the U.S. during the humid summer of 1980. The victims of heat stress are usually the elderly, the very young, the poor, or people weakened by illnesses such as heart disease or alcoholism.

Dr. Jim Cheek, of the Texas Department of Health's Bureau of Disease Control and Epifew days of a heat wave with high humidity are particularly dangerous." He explained that generally four to seven days are needed for people to acclimate to elevated temperatures. Dr. Cheek noted that most cases of serious heat-related illness occur early in the summer.

Heat-related illness includes a broad spectrum ranging from simple heat cramps to lifethreatening heat stroke. Although many persons with heat stroke have some form of debilitating disease, healthy young persons may develop heat stroke following strenuous physical exertion. The warning signs of impending heat stroke may be few, and loss of consciousness may be the first sign.

Dr. Cheek stated that "people can prevent heatrelated illness by drinking more fluids, preferably water, before exposure." In addition, he noted, "Particularly susceptible people such as the elderly and the very young should wear light, loosefitting clothing, take frequent baths, avoid strenuous activity, and remain in a cool place."

Local weather forecasts can be a guide to the danger of heat-related illness. and "Waste: A Hidden Resource" for secondary school students. Under its contract with TDH, Keep Texas Beautiful will supplement the national program with materials specifically for Texas.

Some Texas schools are already using the national education program. Others will be added over the next three years as the program expands across the state. For the 1989-1990 school year, the most recent year for which figures are available, more than 564 schools were teaching "Waste in Place" to 311,061 students. "This was a 55 percent increase over the previous year, said SueAnn Wade-Crouse, president of Keep Texas Beautiful. Teachers devoted 98,931 hours to teaching the elementary program. In the same communities, "Waste: A Hidden Resource" was used by 48 percent of the secondary schools, reaching nearly 250,000 students. The Keep Texas Beau-

tiful organization has a 20-year history of provid-

ing leadership and education in litter reduction, reeyeling and other solid waste issues. The organization's \$348,948 eontract with TDH will include developing and disseminating lesson plans to Texas public and private schools, training teachers to use them, and evaluating the program after the first year.

Educators from the Science Aeademy of Austin, located at the Lyndon B. Johnson High School, will work with the contractor to develop the Texas-specific material. The Science Academy is a "magnet school" for advanced students at the high school

The supplemental issues will be identified by Bureau of Solid Waste Management staff and provided to the contractors. Materials will be developed during the summer and fall of 1991. Teacher training, dissemination of the materials, and implementation of the program in schools are set for spring of 1992. Materials will be correlated with the Texas Education Agency's (TEA) "essential elements" for school curricula and will be submitted to TEA for review prior to dissemination. Teacher training sessions on the material will be designed so that teachers receive Advanced Academic Training credit for their participation. This is a form of continuing education credit required to maintain teacher certification.

Funding for the contract comes from solid waste disposal fees collected by the Bureau of Solid Waste Management under the Solid Waste Disposal Act. "The program is just one step the bureau is taking to fulfill a legislative mandate to provide public awareness and education on solid waste issues," Outlaw said. "Through awareness of waste problems and alternative disposal habits, Texas children can help reduce the state's dependence on landfills," he added.


