8, where it began its step-by-step trip The first kilometer of the project was run by Bill Thorpe, Jr. and Gina Hemphill, grandchildren of Thorpe and Jesse Owens.
Thousands of young Americans are
getting the opportunity to carry the getting the opportunity to carry the torch this year, in more than 1500 paying $\$ 3,000$ per kilometer for the paying $\$ 3,000$ per kilome and women
