**Texas Farm and Ranch Safety Week** September 15-21 is Texas Farm and Ranch Safety Week. This week highlights activities to help bring about safer behavior by making people more aware of the true costs of accidents and occupational illnesses. Through education and training of accident prevention measures, rural workers and families can reduce accidents in everyday activities. Safety protects agriculture's greatest resource, You!

- Protect yourself by reading and following instructions in operator's manuals, on labels and safety signs.
- Protect yourself by inspecting all facilities and equipment for hazards, then correcting or avoiding them.
- Protect yourself by keeping machinery guards in place and stopping machines before dealing with operating problems.
- Protect yourself by

- equipping tractors with rollover protection and wearing a seat belt.
- Protect yourself and your family by being prepared for emergencies and having a home fire escape plan.
- Protect your children by keeping them off machinery and away from danger, and by assigning older children chores or work they can do safely.
- Protect yourself, your family and fellow citizens by making safety part of every activity - at work, at home, at leisure and on the road.

**Hay Harvesting & Transportation Safety**

Ashaybaling and transportation on public roads gets into full swing, so do injuries. The baler itself can catch the unwary operator if the operator gets too close. There have been instances where operators have been pulled into the baler and killed. In others, people

had parts of their bodies burned away by friction caused by moving belts.

Because there is friction, heat can build up and cause the bale to catch fire. This can be a definite problem and it is good to carry a fire extinguisher on the baler. If you have time, drop the bale and drive equipment away, then release the baler from the tractor if the fire is still present.

Large, round bales can roll after being dropped. In some hilly areas, bales have rolled down hills, broke through fences and rolled over people causing injury. The large bales usually weigh between 1,000 and 1,500 pounds and must be moved mechanically. Many farmers are using their regular materials handling equipment to move hay bales. Many are not designed to handle this type of load and create a hazard.

Side overturns have resulted when tractor-mounted front-end loaders were used to move bales and the load was not properly balanced. Another dangerous situation results from raising the loader too high. The bale can come down on the operator, crushing

him.

Three-point hitch attachments are the safest of the two types mentioned. A tractor of at least 60 horsepower with proper ballast should be able to safely lift and transport a large bale. The following suggestions will make the job of moving bales safer:

- Be sure the lifting device has some means of preventing the bale from accidentally falling off, such as a spear or clamp.
- Lift the bale only high enough to clear obstructions during transport.
- Travel at a slow, safe speed and lock tractor brake pedals together.
- Back up steep slopes to keep the front wheels from lifting off the ground.

Front-end loader attachments for moving large round bales may be more useful than rear-mounted devices, but they are also much more dangerous. Dangers include bales rolling down the loader lift arms onto the operator and tractor overturns. For these reasons, it is recommended that front-end loaders be used only on tractors equipped with a four-post or full cab ROPS and safety belt. Although not designed to

provide protection from falling objects, the ROPS may afford some protection. If your tractor is not so equipped, contact your dealer about ROPS availability and prices.

Front-end loaders used for handling large round bales must have a spear, clamp or some other means of preventing the bale from rolling down the loader arms. These can also prevent accidentally dropping the bale during handling. To reduce risks of overturning the tractor, follow these suggestions:

- Be sure tractor has proper ballast, such as fluid in rear tires, wheel weights and a heavy, rear-mounted implement.
- Set wheel spacing as wide as possible.
- Keep the bale as close to the ground as possible during movement. Raising the loader shifts the center of gravity of the machine and greatly reduces stability.
- Always travel at a slow, speed and avoid sudden or jerky turns, especially on slopes.

Some 30,000 roadway accidents involving slow-moving agricultural equipment occur each year, causing loss of life, limb and property to both

slow-moving vehicles (SMV) operators and motor vehicle operators. A primary rule for safe transportation of hay is to be able to see and be seen. Make sure a SMV emblem can be easily seen by traffic. Keep it clean, if its color or fluorescence is fading, replace it.

Be sure all lights and reflectors are clean and operative. Use your flashing lights any time you drive on public roads and avoid traveling at night.

Safety is a topic many people are not concerned with... until after an accident has happened. This is very unfortunate because most accidents are easily prevented. Be concerned, accidents are extremely costly in terms of lost production, property damage, medical expenses and possible legal actions.

Felicity is a member of the Eastland Senior 4-H Club and is a freshman at Eastland High School.

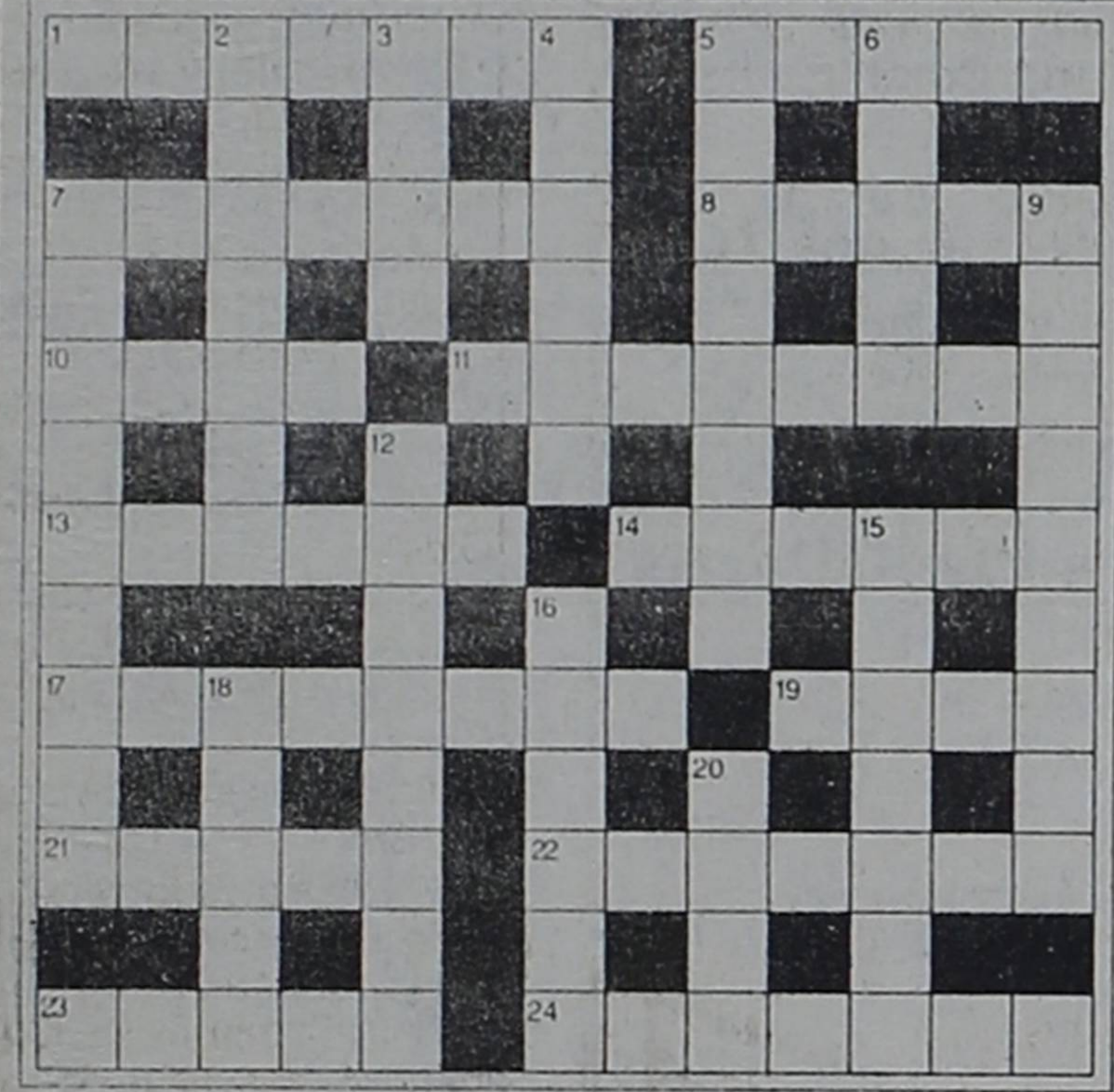



Sufferers of Gaucher's disease improved greatly when given doses of the enzyme lacking in those with the genetic disease, say researchers at the National Institutes of Health, in Bethesda, Maryland. The Food and Drug Administration is expected to approve the treatment soon.

September 15, 1991, Lake Leon will be the site of the Annual Eastland County Bass Club Open Tournament. Headquarters will once again be at Chock-o-Block at the state ramp.

A change in rules for this year's event has brought a number of phone calls and comments. The waters of Lake Leon were declared off limits the entire week this year. In previous years the closing date was set for Wednesday. This rule change was noted on the fliers printed for this event, but some anglers were not on the mailing list were not aware of this change. These gentlemen are by rights unable to enter this event for fear of failing a polygraph exam. Anglers as I understand are permitted to be on the water but must not fish. For an official ruling you need to contact an

Eastland County Bass Club member.

The 1991 Anglers Choice Pro Draw schedule has been released or the dates have not been decided on as of now. The dates February 6-9, March 26-29, May 28-31, June 25-28, July 23-26. This circuit is growing each year and drawing more veteran anglers compete at lakes around the country. Anglers Choice Pro Draw and Team Circuits are based out of Texas and headed up by Johnny Davis, of Granbury.

Have you ever wondered why a tournament fisherman has eight, ten or even 12 rigged rods in the boat? Well, there are a dozen reasons. Just as a serious golfer wouldn't try to drive with a putter or putt with a driver, a serious fisherman wouldn't try to 'flip' with an ultra light spinning outfit. If the fish are tight to cover a Flippin Stick and tech-

nique allow the angler to make a pinpoint presentation. The length and heft of a flippin stick and heavy line allow the angler to control big fish and quickly work them from heavy cover.

Why not use a flippin stick all the time? Well if the fish are spooky or in ultra clear water or reacting to cold front conditions, the angler needs a much more 'fine-tuned' presentation. A small lure and light line may be the only way to overcome those conditions. A light or even ultra-light spinning rig would best fit the bill.

What about active, aggressive, feeding fish? A medium action baitcast outfit would allow you to cast and retrieve a fast moving crankbait. You catch a few fish, but the action slows. Switching to a medium heavy baitcast outfit you begin throwing a surface buzz bait. The fish are swirling at the bait but striking short. Time to switch back to a medium outfit and plastic worm to quickly reach that same fish with pinpoint accuracy. If you take time to re-tie the other

medium weight outfit the fish will have probably changed location. The extra rigged medium outfit with a different lure presentation was the answer, the right tool for the job.

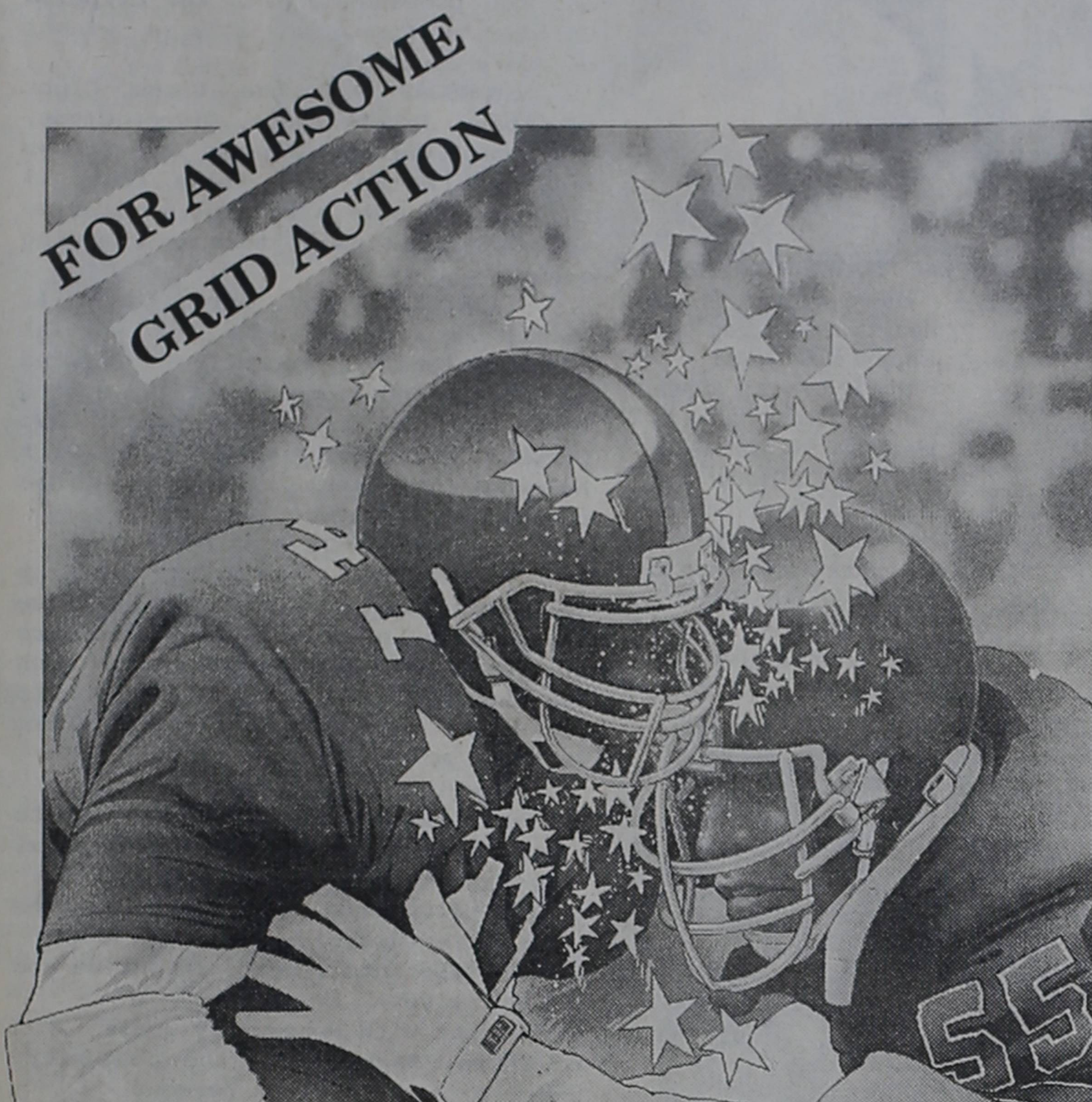

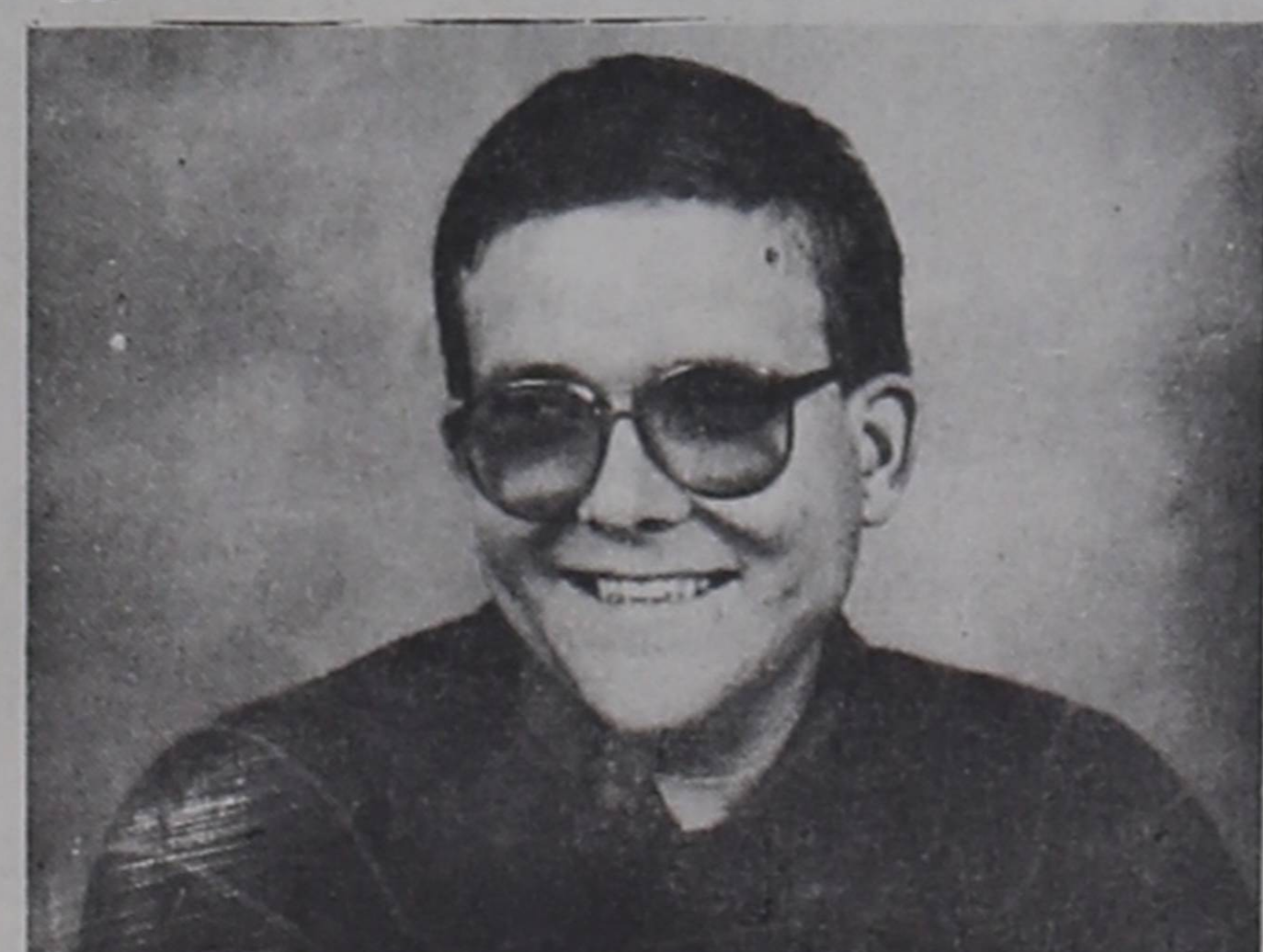
