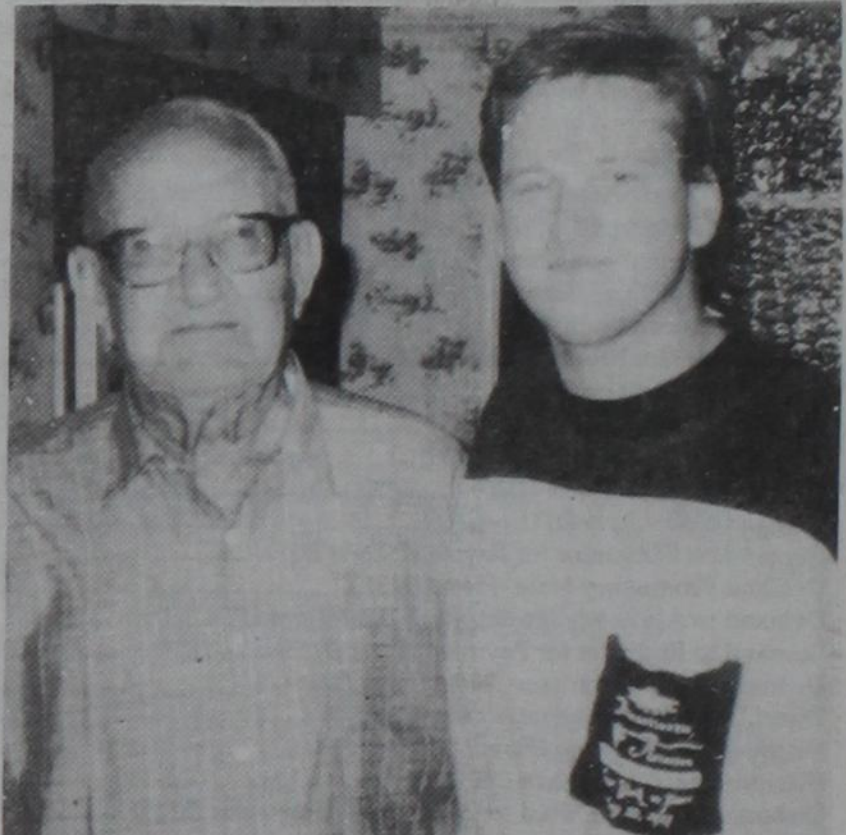

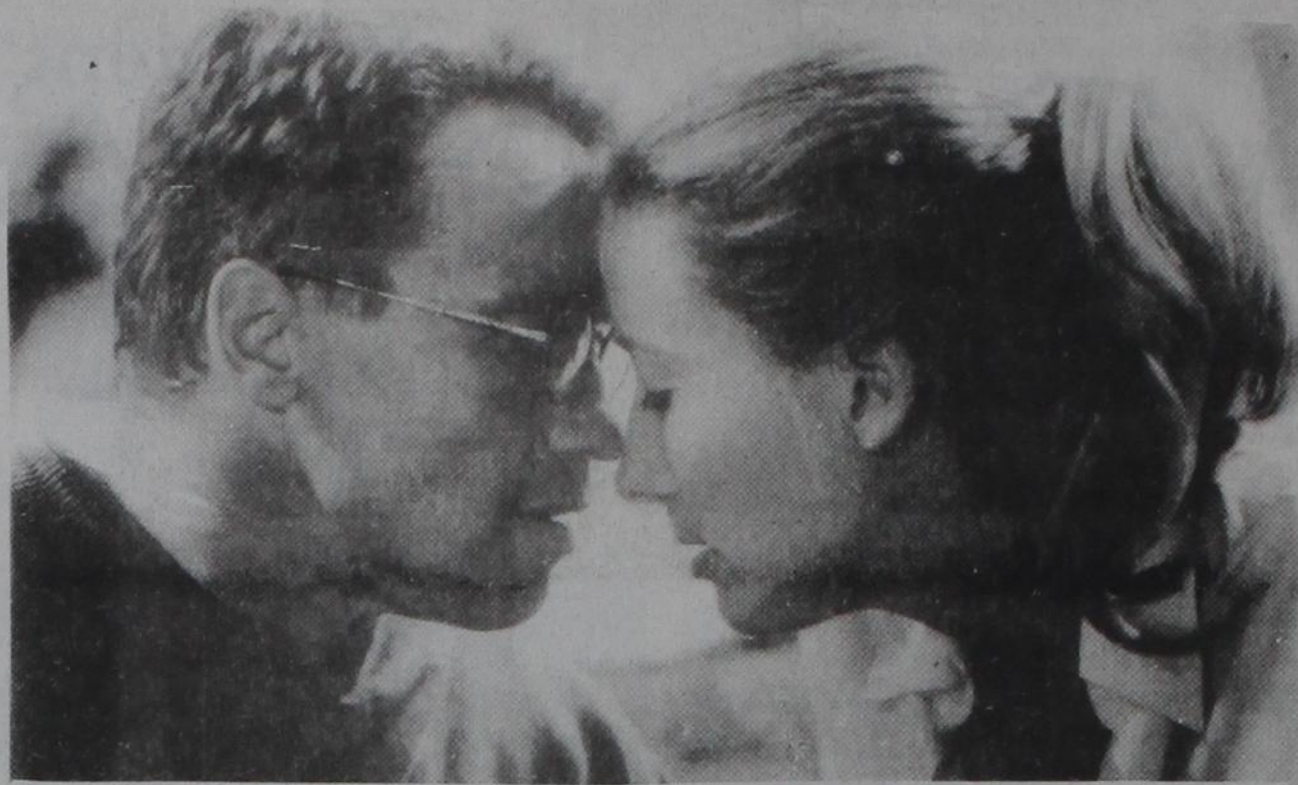
What begins as a daring medical experiment soon leads to unexpected and wondrous consequences in "Junior," a new film presented by Universal Pictures.

The people of Moran had a very nice, quiet weekend. Most everyone watched the Cowboys get beat in the football game.

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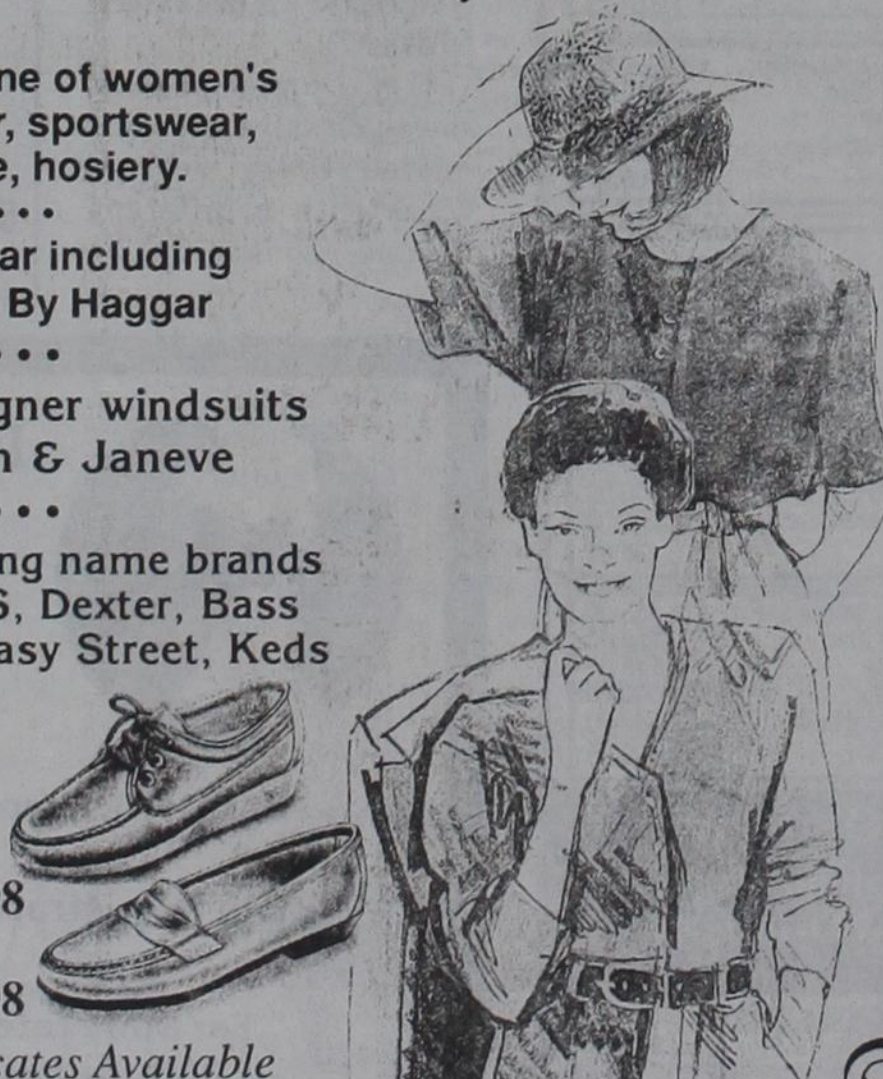

HIGHLIGHTS

AUSTIN — Wall-to-wall crowds in the newly-restored Capitol greeted lawmakers last week as the Texas Legislature's 74th session got under way.

It was standing room only in both the House and Senate galleries as family members and political supporters came to watch their legislators take office.

Closed-circuit telecasts around the Capitol complex drew overflow crowds as well. Sen. Mario Gallegos, D-Houston, until Tuesday a House member, brought 600 constituents to watch him take the oath of office.

But lawmakers managed to do some work before adjourning following the second day of the session.

Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock was surprised when Sen. John Whitmire, D-Houston, quickly persuaded all 31 senators to co-sponsor a bill that would impose a three-month moratorium on vehicle emissions testing in the state's four largest metropolitan areas.

Bullock said the bill, which has strong support in the House, could pass in a matter of days. The testing began Jan. 2.

Speaker Laney Re-elected

On the House side, the first order of business was the re-election of James E. "Pete" Laney, D-Hale Center, as the 71st Speaker of the Texas House of Representatives.

Laney pledged to help remove any barriers preventing people

from contributing their talents and ideas to the legislative process. "Every person should be able to make their voice heard in this chamber," Laney said.

He noted that any citizen with a home computer can have access to the legislative information systems to track the progress of legislation.

"I want the people of Texas to be a part of this process more than ever before," Laney said.

Laney, 51, who was first elected speaker in January 1993, also pledged to balance the state budget without increasing state taxes.

Tort Reform Bills Filed

Lt. Gov. Bullock and four state senators aim to put a stop to Texas' growing reputation as a hotbed of economic development crippling lawsuit abuse.

Bullock and Sens. Teel Bivins, R-Amarillo; John Montford, D-Lubbock; David Sibley, R-Waco; and Eddie Lucio, D-Brownsville, trotted out a package of bills that would limit the liability of a company where more than one business is to blame and restrict lawsuits filed under the Deceptive Trade Practices Act.

In a news conference last week Bullock implored Sibley to "put these bills on the front burner."

Richard Weekley of the pro-business group, Texans for Lawsuit Reform, praised the introduction of the Senate bills, but mentioned an 11-point program his group is working on that would be more comprehensive.

However, Bill Whitehurst of the Trial Lawyers Association told the *Houston Chronicle* he thought the legislation is "over-reaching." "They're saying we need to do this to the consumers of Texas because we're losing jobs and business, and that's just not true," he commented.

The Senate bills propose to:

■ Cap punitive damages and make them harder to win.

■ Exempt professionals such as accountants, lawyers and real estate agents from the Deceptive Trade Practices Act.

■ Require damage suits to be

filed in the county in which the action occurred.

■ Allow a plaintiff to collect damages only when a defendant is at least 50 percent to blame.

MHMR Waiting List Grows

More than 40,000 Texans are on waiting lists for services from the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, according to a report which will be released by the agency later this month.

The latest figures, up from 30,500 in 1992, include 28,000 persons with a mental illness and 12,000 with mental retardation. Some people have been on the waiting list for more than four years.

Ann K. Utley, chairman of the MHMR board, said the waiting list needs cannot be met because of funding limitations. She estimates more than \$150 million per year is necessary to meet the needs of the individuals on the waiting lists.

Return Those Donations

The owners of Houston's race track have asked officeholders and candidates to whom they made political donations to return the money because the contributions apparently were illegal.

Spokespeople for Gov. Ann Richards and Attorney General Dan Morales, both of whom received \$10,000, said they would comply.

Sam Houston Race Park director Byron Wade said he was initially advised that the contributions were legal but recently learned that the Texas Ethics Commission had ruled that a partnership, such as Sam Houston, that includes one or more corporate partners is prohibited from making campaign donations.

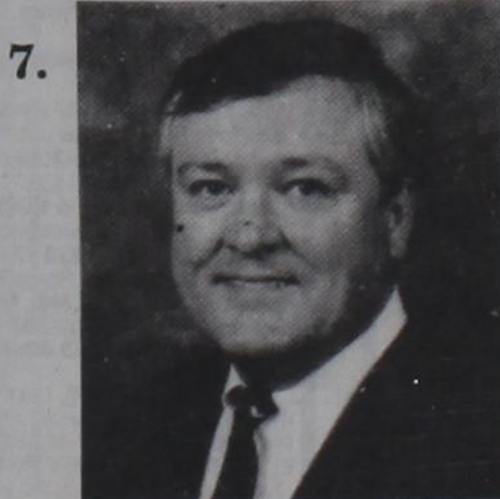

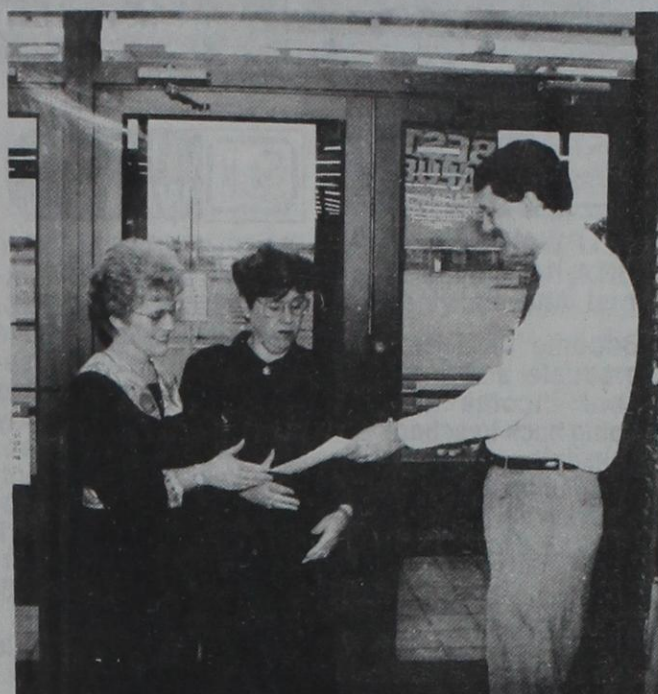

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Believe it or not but the site of Dr. Jolly's dental office was formerly a roominghouse that served boardinghouse style meals. Frank Crowell told me that when he first arrived in Eastland after his discharge from the army, at the end of WW I, he only had five dollars to hold him until he got a job of some sort. This boardinghouse at that time was operated by a Mrs. Hague who was the mother of Weaver Hague. Mr. Crowell told me he could not get a room at this house but she did have a cot out in the back under a tent that she allowed him to sleep on. The next day a vacancy turned up in the house so Frank was able to move indoors.

Gulf Refining Company placed a filling station on this lot and if one looks carefully he can see where the services lanes of this service station ran. This station at first was a company owned and operated station where the employees wore those cute little Gulf orange shirts and pants. However, it should be noted that the company did not operate this station very long, but leased it out to an independent operator.

The place where Scott's Body Shop was located, was originally a service station built by the Panhandle Refining Company. This was a small company that had at that time quite a bit of oil production in this county. It was a Wichita Falls concern. The man who operated this station for Panhandle was Claude Lowe who also had a business over on Main Street in the building on the west end of Higginbotham - Bartlett Lumber. At this location he was a local dealer for Hupmobile automobiles and he also was the agent for a much smaller car that was not connected to Hupp Motor Co. that sold under the name of the "Star."

This auto had one feature that I don't think another car on the market had. That was the fact that this car had such a rigid front end that Claude occasionally used to take one of the front wheels off the car and drive it around the square.

I will be having more to say about this explosion later, but for the moment my next discussion will be with the firms that were located on the West side of the Courthouse square.

on three wheels. On any other car the front end would hit the ground where the wheel was removed, but that was not the case of the Star. It dropped somewhat but still it did not drop all of the way to the ground.

But back to the Panhandle Station next door to the Methodist Church. When this building was built, the east side and the north sides were open. Mr. Lowe had an office back on the far corner of the building. But under the shelter of the roof of this building there were several pumps and for a while this too was a very busy service station. There was a woman by the name of Mrs. Weaver, who was not related to the States Oil people, Joseph Weaver, who operated a cafe in this building. It was a small cafe with a short counter and only a table or two but it seemed to do a pretty good business. Mrs. Weaver had a son who was about my age by the name of Hayward and a daughter named Martha Frances. The daughter came back to our homecoming for several years. It seems that she and her husband who lived in Wickett, I think it was, were in the generator business.

Martha Frances told me she could rewind a general top as well as any man could. And knowing her I suspect she was right about that.

Across the street from this building stands a building which at one time was known as The Texas Hotel. And gained a little popularity in the eyes of many Eastlanders when Frank Bida's place blew up. This was a garage with filling station front end that also provided storage facilities for people who might be staying at the Connellee Hotel on Main Street. This building has never been rebuilt but it has been in continuous usage almost ever since the explosion.

I will be having more to say about this explosion later, but for the moment my next discussion will be with the firms that were located on the West side of the Courthouse square.

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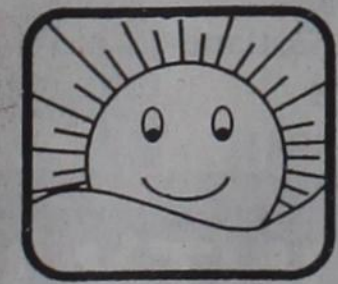

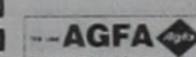
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Kokomo News

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Pharmacy Topics

Growing a patient's own cartilage cells in a test tube and then injecting the tissue into a knee or other damaged joint is getting promising results in tests in Sweden. Further studies are planned.

Researchers at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston have noted a link between megadoses of zinc and the formation of plaque on brain cells that is associated with Alzheimer's disease.

Scientists at Johns Hopkins University are studying the use of testosterone supplements for older men. Someday they may be as common as estrogen for women to reverse the effects of aging, doctors say.

"Candies" laced with hot pepper helped reduce pain in a number of patients with mouth sores caused by chemotherapy or radiation. Yale Cancer Center doctors plan a larger-scale test soon.

Coating ear tubes with silver oxide seems to reduce further ear infections in at-risk children, a study at the University of California/Davis found. The coating seems to act as a disinfectant.

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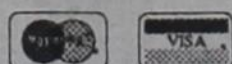

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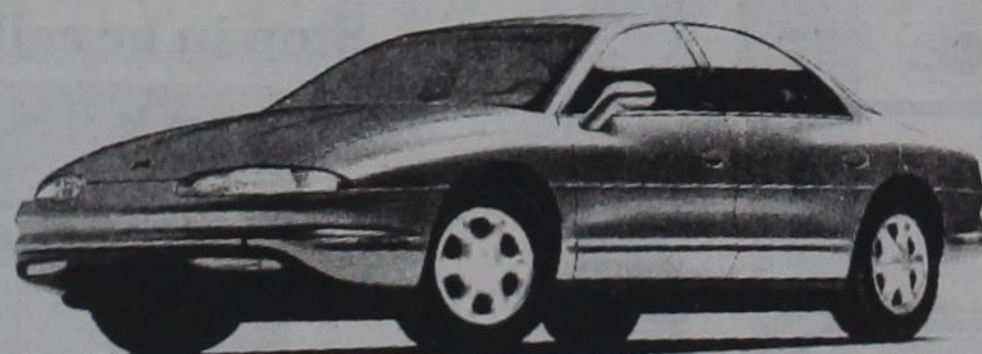

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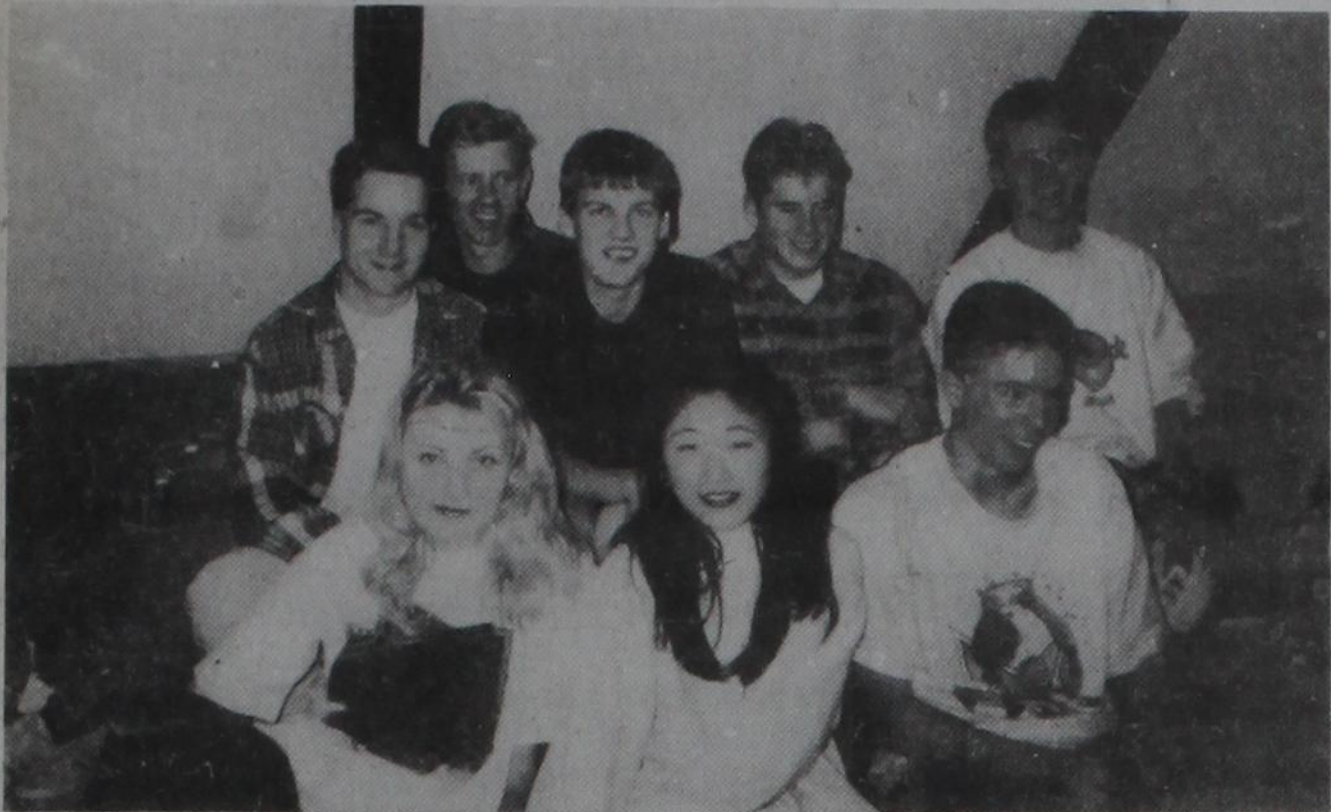

We are the survivors!!! Consider the changes we have witnessed!!!

We were born before television, before penicillin, before polio shots, frozen foods, Xerox, plastic, contact lenses, Frisbees, and the pill. We were before radar, credit cards, split atoms, laser beams and ballpoint pens. Before pantyhose, dishwashers, clothes dryers, electric blankets, air conditioners, drip-dry clothes . . . and before man walked on the

moon!

We got married first and then lived together. How quaint can you be? In our time, closets were for clothes, not for "coming out . . ." Bunnies were small rabbits, not long-legged, barebreasted women, and rabbits were not Volkswagens. Designer jeans were scheming girls named Jean, and having a meaningful relationship meant getting along with our cousins.

We thought fast food was what you ate during Lent, and Outer Space was the back of the Brady Theater. We were before house husbands, gay rights, computer dating, dual careers and commuter marriages. We were before day-care centers, group therapy and nursing homes. We never heard of FM radio, tape decks, electronic typewriters, artificial hearts, word processors, yogurt and guys wearing earrings. For us, time-sharing meant togetherness . . . not computers or condominiums. A chip meant a piece of wood. Hardware meant tools, and software wasn't even a word!

Back then, "Made in Japan" meant junk and the term "making out" referred to how you did on your exam. Pizzas, McDonald's and instant coffee were unheard of. We hit the scene when there

were 5 and 10-cent stores where you bought things for 5 and 10 cents! Our drug store soda fountains sold ice cream cones for a nickel or a dime. For one nickel you could ride a street car, make a phone call, buy a Pepsi, or enough stamps to mail one letter and two postcards. You could buy a new Chevy coupe for \$600. . . but who could afford one? A pity too, because gas was 11 cents a gallon.

In our day grass was mowed, Coke was a cold drink and pot was something you cooked in. Rock music was a Grandma's lullaby and AIDS were helpers in the Principal's Office. We were certainly not before the difference between the sexes was discovered, but we were surely before sex changes! We made do with what we had. And we were possibly the last generation to be so dumb as to think you needed a husband to have a baby!

No wonder we are so confused and there is such a generation gap today.

But, WE SURVIVED! What better reason to celebrate!
