Customers will not be immeCustomers wil not be imme- diately affected by this change except that the Commission will no longer regulate rates for monthly extension wiring and equipment leased by the Cooperative. Rates for local service (excluding for local service (excluding telephones and other equipment) will not change as a result of this filing. <br> The proposed changes include the revision of service connection charges, the establishment of returned check charge of $\$ 15.00$, the deletion of services no longer provided and the provision of new custom calling services. custom calling services.
