But then Molly said: "I want a sprig of that fig James was in a hurry to get down the road, and didn'twant any delay. But finally Molly convinced him to dig up a shoot of the tree. She wrapped it

Review by the Appraisal Review Board If you can't resolve your problem informally
th the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).
The appraisal review board (ARB) is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems has the power to order the appraisal district to has the power to order the appraisal district you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notification of the time, date, and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the
appraisal district office located on the second floor of the Eastland County Courthouse, Eastland,

haven't talked about your case before the ARB

## Review of the District Court

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of it's order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at $\$ 1,000,000$ or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser with 15 antice of appeal with the chief appraiser within

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason eyond your control, like a medical emergency.

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the information.

Special Deadlines
For change of use (the appraisal district in formed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of change that increases tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline s before the 30th day after the notice of determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may fie a protest until the day before taxes become elinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence
about whether a required notice was mailed to you.
