THIS WEEK'S unveiling of the reconditioned Statue of Liberty has sparked a lot of interest, due to the 100th anniversary of the statue.

(Some Texans may view the ceremonies as somewhat bittersweet, since the statue's anniversary has put the state's Sesquicentennial celebration in the "back seat." The U.S. Treasury refused a request to issue an official Texas coin, as it did in 1936, due to the "Miss Liberty" coins it already had planned).

the cleaning project has been a considerable task, and as you may have noticed, a quite costly one as

One of the most noticeable changes will be in Miss Liberty's torch, which has been completely refabricated. It was pointed out that 100 years of "improvements" in the old torch had left it a leaking evesore.

The new torch is covered with 24-karat gold gilding. It is illuminated during the day by the sun's rays and at night by powerful spotlights. The new flame is an exact replica of the 1886 original, which had been replaced by a flame which used lamps for

illumination. The structural skeleton inside the statue's left arm, which was weak and sagging due to holding up the two-ton torch for the past 100 years, has been rebuilt and reconnected to the central pylon. A hole in the statue's arm, caused when the arm swayed into one of the crown spikes, has been patched.

All seven spikes in Miss Liberty's crown have been refurbished. The 25 windows in the observation deck were replaced.

The 1800 iron ribs between the statue's copper skin and its framework were replaced. Approximately 10,000 loose and missing rivets, which were used to attach the copper skin, have been By Court replaced.

On Liberty's inner skin, seven coats of paint and two layers of tar were removed, using liquid nitrogen cooled to nearly 350 degrees below zero and oldfashioned baking soda. The inside has been repainted with a new compound developed by NASA.
