

# **At Prosecutor's Request Ranger College English All Charges Against White Building Being Moved Dropped In 'Unique' 91st Case**

In a dramatic turn of events in 91st District Court Thursday prosecutors from the State Attorney General's office dropped all charges against former Sheriff Ronnie White.

In the misdemeanor case of Official Oppression, being tried this week, White was accused of removing a fence owned by Mike McPhail on County Rd. 483 (Alameda Cemetery Rd.) without a If you donated proper order. He was also accused of threatening McPhail.

One other indictment was related to the fence incident, and another was not.

# Many 'Firsts'

Wednesday, beginning with Attorney Siedler of Fort Worth, a lawyer hired by **McPhail** Siedler said he "didn't think McPhail had hindered anyone" in moving his fence at the Alameda Cemetery Rd. The Attorney also said he had telephone conversations and a meeting with Sheriff White, in which White told him he thought McPhail had blocked access. Upon questioning by Lewellen, Siedler said he thought the Sheriff was just trying to do

Wednesday, On County Judge Scott Bailey testified that he began to learn about the fence last summer. He said he signed a Commissioners Court order Sept. 11 to "seek removal of the fence." Bailey said the order did not give anyone authority to tear the fence down.

The order he signed was on exhibit in the courtroom, along with photographs of the Alameda Cemetery Rd. Bailey said he was attending a funeral on Sept. 25 when the motion came up to have the McPhail fence removed by 5 p.m. the next day. Commissioners Pittman and Ainsworth voted to have



Siedler had apparently advised McPhail not to meet with the Commissioners Court about the Cemetery Road, but to send a letter instead.

He said he thought there would be a "large amount of citizens involved in almost a riot...demanding that the Sheriff do things" at the September Commissioners Court meeting.

Apparently Siedler was referring to the Alameda Cemetery Association, which met with the Court in June, August and September of 1995 requesting an order that the McPhail fence be removed.



# **First Flight Called To Vehicle Rollover**

A family's trip to Abilene fell short Saturday afternoon, June 15, when their west bound 1996 Ford Crown Victoria left the roadway and rolled several times at the 323 mile marker I-20 about 3 miles east of Putnam.

Evelyn Johnson, 74, of Lamesa, California, fell asleep and drifted off the road and overcorrected, causing the vehicle to roll and land on its top in the center median, according to DPS Trooper, Stan Waters. Callahan County dispatch was notified of the accident at 4:45 p.m.

Mrs. Johnson and her husband, Jesse Johnson, 73, got out of the vehicle along with Amanda Suba, 8, before emergency personnel arrived. Paul Suba, 12, was extricated from the upside-down vehicle by rescuers from Cisco and Baird Fire Departments, Eastland County, and citizens E.M.S. personnel.

Paul Suba was loaded onto "First Flight" helicopter for transport to Hendrick Hospital due to the severity of his injuries.

Amanda Suba was transported to Hendrick Hospital by Citizen E.M.S. and Jesse was transported to Hendrick by an Eastland ambulance.





Curtain time will be 7:30 p.m. nightly, with admission at the box office still \$3.50. Adults can obtain balcony seats, if they like, for \$5.


This movie is rated PG-13, and should appeal to a wide age range.







## **BARTERING AND TAXES**

"If you mow my lawn, I will paint your house." Businesses everywhere are now trading goods and services, either directly or through bartering clubs. Members in these clubs earn "barter dollars" by providing their goods or services to club members. These barter dollars can then be used to purchase goods and services offered by other members.

Trading for goods and services allows businesses to conserve cash. Bartering also provides a way for businesses to utilize excess capacity. Unfortunately, bartering does not provide tax advantages. A business must include the value of bartered goods or services it receives when computing its taxable income. For example, if an accountant performs tax services for a dentist, who in turn cleans the accountant's teeth, both professionals must include in taxable income the value of the other's services.

If a business uses barter dollars to make a business purchase, it may deduct that purchase as a business expense. On the other hand, a business may not deduct the value of personal goods or services purchased with barter dollars, and such a purchase may result in additional income for the owner.

Bartering clubs are required to annually report bartering transactions to the IRS (as well as to the traders) using Form 1099-B. Business owners who don't barter through a club may be required to file Form 1099-MISC with the IRS.

Bartering can be a good supplement to regular business, but too much bartering can rob a company of the cash it needs to meet payroll or purchase inventory. Bartering can also trigger an unexpectedly large tax bill, and a company that barters extensively may need to adjust its quarterly estimated tax payments.



# **Texas 4-H Program Reaches More Youth Than Ever**

The Texas 4-H program, the largest youth organization in the state, has

grown even bigger. At the end of 1995, the state 4-H and youth development program of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service reported a 4-H membership of 628,172, almost 16 percent of all Texas youth age 5 to 19. "Enrollment increased about 44 percent between 1993 and 1995," said Dr. Nelson Jacob, 4-H and youth development specialist. "It has more than doubled from 308,000 since 1989."

"What we are observing is an increase in diversity," he said. "The 4-H program is reaching new audiences, appealing to a broader cross section of youth. Also, the increase demonstrates the soundness of current educational programs tied to practical experiences, which capture the minds of young people."

Part of the success of the program can be credited to a variety of learning opportunities provided through 4-H projects based on current research and designed to target youth in specific age groups, said Dr. Lynne Thibodeaux, assistant director of the 4-H and youth development proFigures show that 4-H

appeals to a wide range of youth-preschool through 12th grade, rural and urban, and all ethnic groups. About 62 percent of 4-H members live in cities and suburbs; nearly 26 percent live in towns; and close to 12 percent live on farms and in rural areas. Children 8 and younger are called 4-H Clover Kids and make up 30 percent of the membership; 48 percent of 4-Hers are ages 9 to 11; 11 percent are 12 or 13; and 11 percent are 14 and older.

Texans are realizing that 4-H involves more than just animal projects. which are still an integral part of the program, Jacob said. Parents in urban areas are recognizing the value of enrolling children in such projects as consumer life skills, foods and nutrition, aerospace and horticulture.

The opportunities for youth to communicate with others from various backgrounds, for older children - teen leaders - to teach younger members and for families to work together with their children continue to be a main reason for 4-H's success, Jacob said.

Youth learn how to make decisions, solve problems, set goals, get along with others and deal with failures and setbacks, Thibodeaux said. Parents also benefit by spending quality time with their children, which increases communication within the family.


