Scattered Rains In The County

Writing about West Texas weather is about as precarious as trying to forecast it! But last weekend brought more showers and cooler weather to the county, with the high temperature on Sunday, July 14, about 85 degrees.

The rainfall was extremely scattered. Gulf clouds would roll in, dump quite a lot of rain in one place, and completely skip the next.

Friday, Saturday and Sunday set a pattern of early morning rain - drenching showers that fell straight down with no wind.

Some of the rains held along a line roughly parallel to I-20, west side of County and south five or six miles.

The heaviest rain of all came in one area north of Desdemona, with four inches reported there. Other heavy rains were west of Cisco, along the line of Eastland/Callahan counties. A total of three and one-half inches fell there.

Inside Cisco totals varied from 1.2 inches up. The pump station at Lake Cisco reported only .5 inch, however.

Lake Cisco is low, although the Lake hasn't dropped to the extremely low level of several years ago, according to Spokesman Ronnie Johnson. There was no runoff from the current rains.

A Scranton resident reported a weekend total of 1.4 inches, certainly beneficial to grassland and peanuts that are just coming up.

Farmers and ranchers S.E. of Cisco reported about the same total, with the heaviest rain coming on Sunday morning. Late Sunday there were several rolls of thunder, but generally the rains had no lightning.

Eastland got 1.2 inches during the weekend rains, says Ron Bailey, District Conservationist of the NRCS. "The showers soaked in well, but we sure need some running water," he adds.

A Ranger Fire Department spokesman reported: "Not much rain in town, it seemed to circle around and miss us."

There were some sprinkles in Ranger Monday afternoon, however.

Reports are that Lake Leon is 73.5 inches, not quite two feet under the spillway. Not much runoff has come into the lake recently. Some people speculate that springs are helping keep the level up.

At Sipe Springs, south side of the county, more than an inch of rain fell during the weekend. Most of this was on Sunday.

Totals at rural areas north and south of Rising Star were less, with .4 of rain reported four miles south of Rising Star, and the same three and one-half miles north. The rain was reported to be heavier right in town, however.

By Tuesday morning the air was drier, with the sky mainly clear. Temperatures

Budget Workshop Concludes Tax Raise Forecast

Eastland County Commissioners spent Thursday going over details of the proposed budget for the next fiscal year, which begins October 1.

According to Judge Scott Bailey they made a great deal of progress at the workshop. But it appears that the County will have an operating deficit of over \$100,000.

Members of the Court met again Friday morning, with plans to finish the workshop around noon. The first item under consideration were to be Road and Bridge Accounts.

Judge Bailey said there would probably need to be a tax raise to take care of increased expenditures by the various Departments. But the tax raise is expected to be below three percent - not enough to generate any roll back attempt.

Still on the table is a three percent cost of living salary raise for all on the county payroll.

In another financial matter, Thursday the Commissioners authorized the County Treasurer to pledge a \$500,000 certificate for operating funds for the rest of the year.

Crime Stoppers Offer Associate Memberships

House Passes Defense of Marriage Act

On Friday, July 12, the House of Representatives considered H.R. 3396, the Defense of Marriage Act. This legislation was introduced earlier this year in order to protect the institution of marriage.

As a co-sponsor of this legislation, I am pleased to report that this bill was passed by a vote of 342 to 67.

The Defense of Marriage Act will protect the institution of marriage by establishing a federal definition of "marriage" only as a legal union between one man and one woman as husband and wife. The definition of "spouse" would be defined only as a person of the opposite sex who is a husband or wife.

The passage of this legislation will give states the right to reject the validity of gay marriages recognized by other states. In addition, "married" gay couples would also remain ineligible for federal benefits.

I have consistently opposed legislation which would grant special status to a lifestyle which I believe is morally wrong and which goes against our society's Biblical and ethical values.

The Senate is expected to consider this bill shortly. The President supports this measure and has indicated he will sign it.

Many, many folks in the 17th District wrote and called to express their strong support for this bill and I very much appreciated their taking the time to do so.

FCIC Approves Crop Revenue Coverage (CRC) For 1997 Wheat Crop

The Federal Crop Insurance Corporation (FCIC) has approved the sale of Crop Revenue Coverage (CRC) to Texas wheat farmers. Texas is one of seven states in which CRC will be available for wheat farmers on a pilot project basis.

Earlier this year, I urged Secretary of Agriculture Dan Glickman and Deputy Administrator for Risk Management Ken Ackerman to approve CRC for 1997 wheat. I am delighted that Texas farmers will have an opportunity to test this innovative risk management tool.

CRC was developed by American Agrisure in conjunction with farmers, commodity groups and the federal government and provides producers with a guarantee for a specific amount of revenue, thus protecting them against price changes as well as yield losses.

As farmers learn to take more of their profit from the marketplace, they need the security other businesses have long enjoyed with revenue insurance. CRC has the potential to provide such security.

CRC offers farmers a safety net as well as the economic security to obtain agricultural loans and the ability to use progressive marketing strategies such as forward

contracting to increase their income.

Because the 1996 farm bill moves domestic producers toward a greater market orientation and reduced federal support, CRC could play a critical role in helping farmers remain profitable under these new circumstances.

Stenholm Votes Against Camouflaged Spending Bill

Washington, D.C.—Congressman Charles Stenholm voted against the 1997 legislative branch appropriations bill for its failure to achieve savings through reductions in the operating expenses of Congressional offices. The bill passed the House on July 10 by a vote of 360-58.

"Supporters of this legislation claim that, at \$1.68 billion, this is a 2 percent reduction over last year's spending," said Stenholm. "In fact, the reduction was achieved by downsizing legislative agencies like the General Accounting Office and the Government Printing Office, and not from Members' office accounts where the reductions also should have been made."

It is estimated that total spending on House accounts will actually increase by 2 percent in 1997.

Stenholm did support a bipartisan amendment to the bill which would require that Members' unspent office allowances be returned to the Treasury to be used for deficit reduction.

"This reform has been a long time coming," Stenholm said. "Right now I have the option of spending the allowance on my

own office operations or handling the money over to Speaker Gingrich. Under those circumstances, I've chosen to keep the money in the services of the 17th District of Texas."

Having passed the House of Representatives, the legislative branch appropriations bill now must be taken up by the Senate. Following Senate passage, a conference committee will resolve differences between the

two versions in order to send a final compromise bill to the President for signature. During that process, the bill could undergo numerous changes.

Stenholm has committed to promoting additional cuts in spending for Congressional operations during that continuing process.

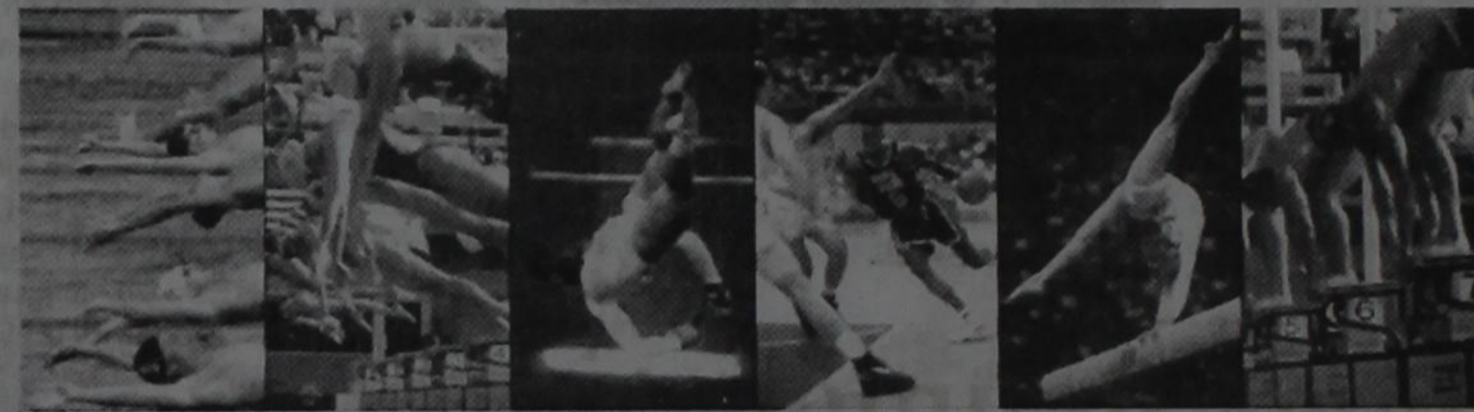
"Members of Congress should lead by example, but so far the pain of these cuts will not be felt by offices on Capitol Hill," added Stenholm.

Political Signs On State Right-Of-Ways May Be Illegal

Think of running for public office and stretching a big campaign banner across a busy road to advertise? Or how about showing a little support for your favorite political candidate by putting up a big sign on your ranch next to a state highway? Those may sound like good ideas, but don't do it without checking with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) first.

As early as 1965, the U.S. Congress began taking steps to ensure the aesthetic quality of our nation's highways with the Highway Beautification Act, which called for the elimination of unnecessary outdoor advertising, particularly on state owned right-of-ways. Two more laws adopted by the Texas Legislature in 1972 and '82 followed, and if not enforced, TxDOT risks losing federal funds used for construction of the state's highway.

The only signs that are legal on state right-of-way, which is usually from fence to fence on any state maintained road, are those that are erected by TxDOT, like speed

limit and directional signs. Any other sign located on state right-of-way is illegal and must be removed, said Brownwood District Engineer Lynn Passmore.

It is legal on some public roads outside the city limits, like farm to market roads, to erect political signs outside the right-of-way no sooner than 90 days prior to the election. These signs must be re-

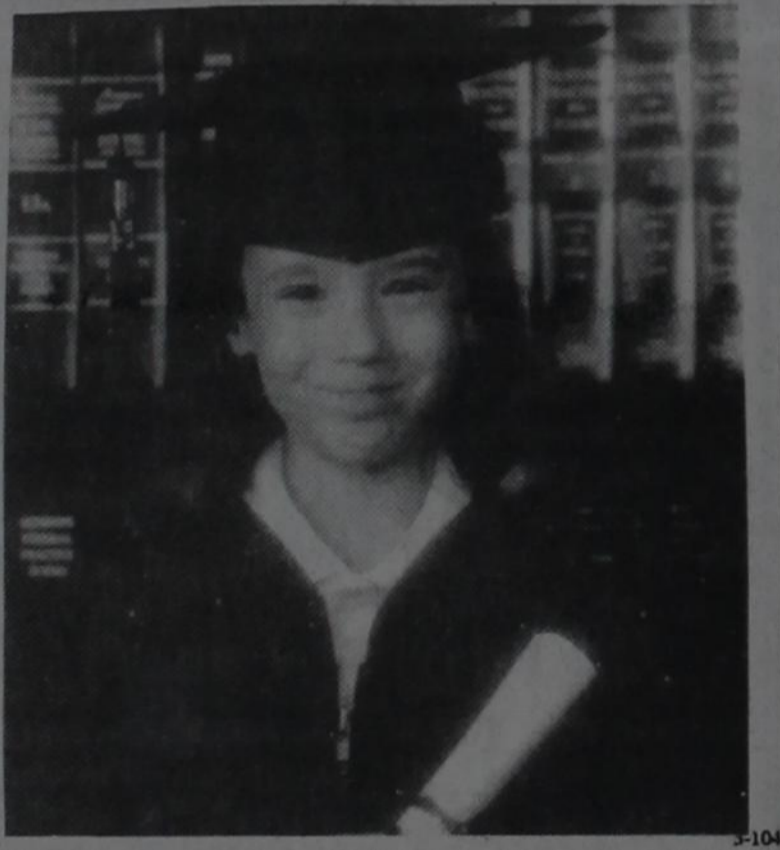

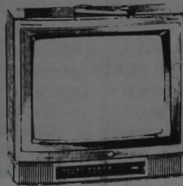
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

The stains had lightened considerably. The second application got her snow-white again, and I think she liked the special treatment.

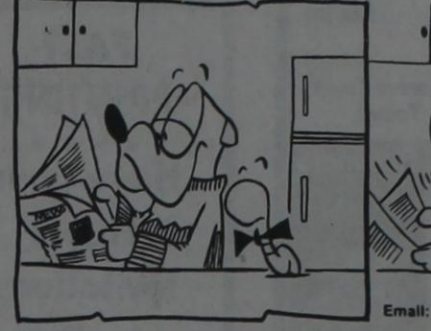
A final brushing made her coat perfect and fluffy!

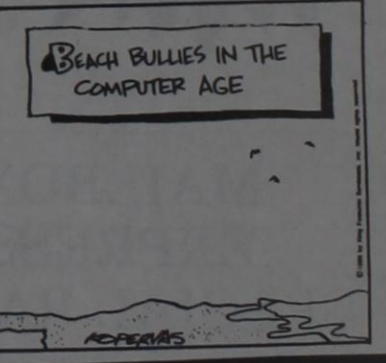

AUSTIN — A proposal passed by the state Senate Education Committee would eliminate tenure — the lifetime guarantee of employment for some college professors and a "carrot" often used to attract the best faculty.

The proposal, which is only a proposal, could strip tenure from professors at public colleges and universities or fire them if they are rated poorly for two consecutive years by peers and students, the *Austin American-Statesman* reported.

Mary Burgan, general secretary of the Washington, D.C.-based American Association of University Professors, said that eliminating tenure would have "a chilling effect on Texas' faculty and a chilling effect on the state's ability to recruit."

An education committee member, Sen. David Sibley, R-Waco, disputed claims by educators' groups that killing tenure would hurt faculty recruitment.

"What this is saying is, if you're a bad professor, don't come to Texas," Sibley told the *American-Statesman*, adding that the proposal is not a response to abuses of the tenure system, but addresses a growing belief that tenure has outlived its purpose.

David Merkowitz, spokesman for the American Council on Education, said an "extreme intervention" like eliminating tenure "can do extraordinary damage to Texas universities."

Presently, the Texas A&M Uni-

versity System is under a regents' directive to revise policies so tenured professors could be removed for poor performance. University of Texas President Robert Berdahl said he favors a post-tenure review that would help professors identify their strengths and improve on their weaknesses.

Reform Party Ballots Mailed
The Reform Party sent out a million presidential nominating questionnaires last week naming Dallas billionaire H. Ross Perot and former Colorado Gov. Richard Lamm as "the potential candidates most frequently mentioned," but Reform Party members can write in any name they wish. Lamm formally announced his candidacy on July 9.

The questionnaires were mailed to people who signed petitions to get the Reform Party on the general election ballot. Party members will have until July 20 to mail in a response.

Candidates who qualify for nomination will be allowed to speak to a Reform Party convention Aug. 11 in Long Beach, Calif.

The name of the nominee will be announced Aug. 18 at a Reform Party meeting in Valley Forge, Pa.

Ruling: Adultery Not Protected

Adultery is not protected by the constitutional right to privacy, the Texas Supreme Court declared last week.

The ruling was against a Sherman police officer who was denied a promotion because of an affair with another man's wife.

The majority opinion, written by Justice Greg Abbott, concludes that the right to privacy "does not include the right to maintain a sexual relationship with the spouse of someone else" but stipulated that the court's decision does not mean that the government is free "to engage in intrusive investigation methods to determine the sexual practices of individuals."

Urbe Vows to Dissolve RRC

Texas Railroad Commission candidate Hector Urbe of Brownsville says he intends to work on dissolving the three-member panel if he is

elected Nov. 5. He said the offices of the three commissioners are "historical anachronisms" that need justification.

Urbe, who is running against Republican commission chairman Carole Keeton Rylander, acknowledged the passage of a constitutional amendment would be necessary to close the agency, but he said the commissioners' jobs could go unfunded in the meantime.

He also said, if elected, he would accept a fraction of the \$79,000 annual salary while trying to transfer the agency's duties to the Department of Public Safety, the Transportation Department and the Public Utility Commission.

Urbe, a Democrat, served in the Texas Senate from 1981 to 1990 and in the Texas House from 1978 to 1981.

Other Capital Highlights

■ A report released last week by the state Senate Economic Development Committee says school property tax abatements granted to businesses are hurting both poor and wealthy school districts. The committee adopted a recommendation that will encourage the 1977 Legislature to find alternatives to the abatements as a way to attract business to Texas. Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock, who presides over the Senate, has never been a fan of tax abatements.

■ Literacy projects in Houston, Bryan, Beaumont, Bastrop, Decatur, Mount Pleasant, Devine, Midland, Marble Falls and Paris will share \$150,000 in grant money from the Barbara Bush Foundation for Family Literacy. Gov. George W. Bush and first lady Laura Bush said the grants were part of their campaign to improve literacy in Texas.

■ An Austin state district judge has granted a temporary injunction to prevent the "Republic of Texas" group from filing bogus liens. Attorney General Dan Morales has said bogus liens filed by the group are clogging the state's property record system. One lien, filed in February, was filed against all state property, the Associated Press reported.

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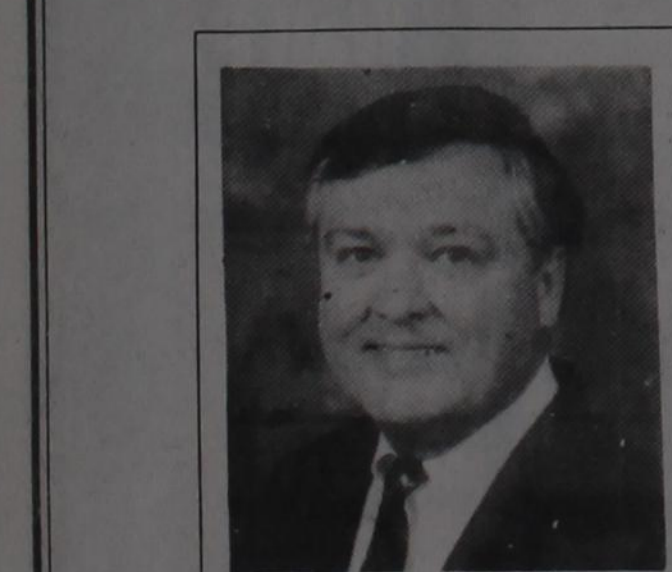

Survey Reveals Baby Boomers Getting Late Start On Parenthood

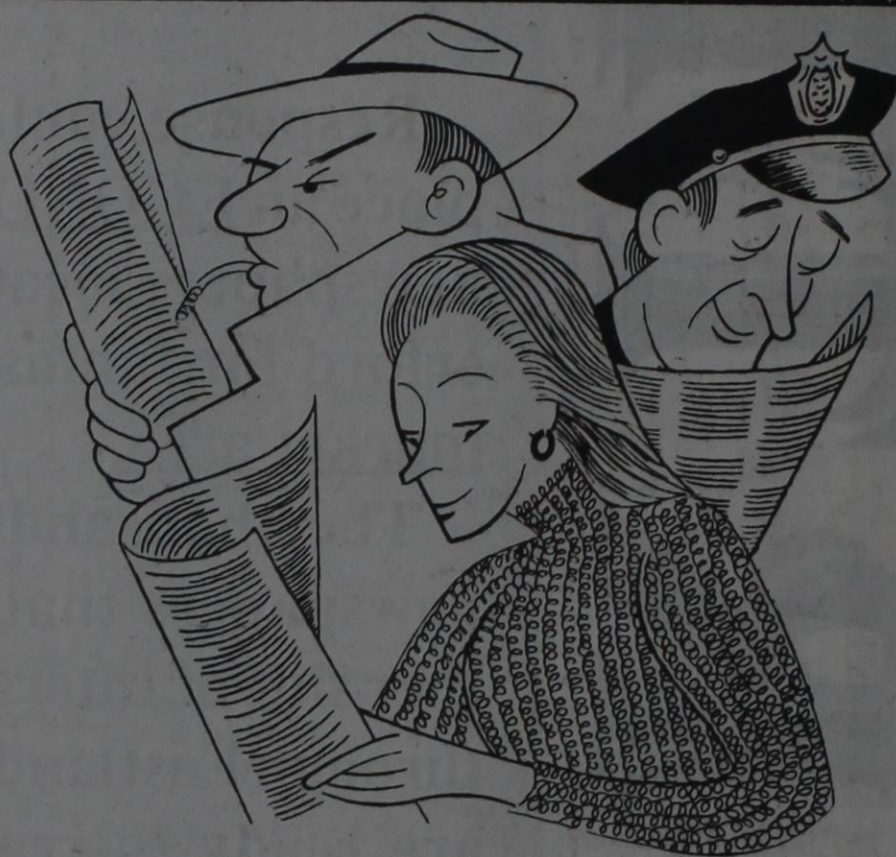
