Christian School Begins Sept. 3 In Eastland Registration Aug. 20

With great excitement, plans are proceeding at a rapid rate for the beginning of the new Christian private school in Eastland.

Faith Christian Academy, as the school will be known, will hold Registration this Tuesday, August 20, from 6-8 p.m. at the Youth Center at Inspiration. Classes begin September 3 for K-12. A kick-off swim party is planned for the first week of school.

The non-denominational school will be located at the Youth Center of Camp Inspiration, which is located approximately two miles west of the Square on Highway 80.

Camp Inspiration is on 54 acres of wooded land, which was established in the early 1900's as a college site. It is equipped with a swimming pool, a baseball field, volleyball court, miniature golf course, a wooded nature trail, playground equipment, a picnic area built around a gazebo, and lots of room to run and play.

The Youth Center, where classes will be held, is located directly behind the church chapel and is equipped with two large rooms, restrooms, and a small kitchen.

The teacher will be Debbie Parsons. Mrs. Parsons is a graduate of

Baylor University and has done post-graduate work at Tarleton University. She is a state-certified teacher. She will be assisted by parent volunteers and new teachers will be hired as the school expands.

Camp Inspiration Church has graciously offered the services of their pastor, Bobby Haddox, for daily devotionals. Since the school will be non-denominational, the services of other ministers in the area will be welcomed.

A board of directors has been selected to operate the school. The school will be a non-profit organization supported by private donations and school tuition. Several fund raisers are in the planning stages and donations will be greatly appreciated.

Besides a basic curriculum, activities planned are field trips, music, art, Bible, elementary Spanish, computers, homemaking, and participation in private school events across the North Texas



Victor Morales Stops In Eastland

Victor Morales, Democratic nominee for the U.S. Senate, drove his little white pickup to the Courthouse Square in Eastland at 4:30 p.m. last Friday,

August 9. He was greeted by June Hicks, County Democratic Chairman, and a crowd of supporters, including a number of County Offi-

cials. A reporter from the L.A. Times was following Morales and his staff in her own car. They had been on the campaign trail all day, with stops at Mineral Wells and Granbury before coming

to Eastland.

Morales is a candidate for the U.S. Senate seat held by Phil Gramm. He made a good showing in the Democratic Primary earlier this year.

It was raining as Morales arrived at Courthouse Square, but that didn't appear to discourage him from maming a speech to the crowd.

He promised to put government into the hands of working people, like himself. Morales is a history teacher in a school in the Metro-Plex.

He challenged incumbent Phil Gramm to promise he's serve a full term as Senator if elected -

and not interrupt these responsibilities to run for President again.

He also touched on other topics, such as education and accountability to the people who elect you to

After leaving Eastland, Morales went on to the Ruiz Restaurant at Cisco, where he had his evening meal. Joining him for a quiet dinner at the Restaurant was his staff, June Hicks, and the L.A. Times reporter.

After this stop Morales drove to Abilene, where he attended the Grand Opening of the Democratic Party Headquarters on North Second St.







Increased Fares For City And Rural Rides

City and Rural Rides (C.A.R.R.) will be increasing fares for all riders beginning September 1, 1996. This is the first increase in fares since the Public Transportation system began seven years ago. The new fares will begin at one dollar (\$1.00) for trips that are five or fewer miles and will increase one dollar for each additional five miles traveled.

The fare increase is due to rapidly increasing operating cost and current reductions of federal funding for transit. Presently C.A.R.R. receives federal, state, and local (fares) funding to operate this very much needed rural public transportation program. If state funding does not make up for the cut in federal funds, C.A.R.R. may be forced into exploring various options that include: reducing services, increasing fares again, or seeking financial support from local governments in their service area.

Any cut in services would greatly affect the majority of C.A.R.R. riders who ride out of necessity including many elderly, low-income, and disindividuals. abled C.A.R.R. provides Rural Public Transportation to the residents of Brown, Callahan, Coleman,

Many families are faced with the problem of deciding if their children are capable of taking care of themselves after school and on holidays. The amount of self care assumed by children varies from family to family. Likewise, the capabilities of children for self care vary from child to child (event within a family). We all know children that are old enough to be responsible, but have not reached that maturity.

So, if you are a parent making this important decision of whether your child is capable of taking care of themselves from the time school is dismissed in the afternoon until you get home from work . . . here is a simple CHECKLIST ABOUT SELF-CARE SCHOOL-AGE CHIL-DREN.

1. Is the child mature enough for practical self-

2. Is the child willing to try partial self-care?

3. Can the child handle problems that could arise? 4. Can the child com-

municate with adults? 5. Can the child handle

For example, if medical improvement can be predicted when your benefits start, your first review could take place within six to 18 months. If medical improvement is possible, but can't be pre-

How does the review

First, we'll send you a letter informing you of the review. The letter will ask you certain questions about your health, and will explain your appeal rights. If it is, we'll ask you to provide detailed information about any medical treatment you've had, and any work you may have done. How will I find out

about your decision? After the review, we'll send you a letter explaining our decision, and the

*You don't cooperate with us in this review of your claim, and you don't

have a good reason for not cooperating.

What happens if I disagree with your decision?



TAX LAW CHANGES IN RECENT LEGISLATION

During the first week of August, Congress hurriedly passed several pieces of legislation and then recessed for the summer. The bills included a small business tax bill and health insurance reform. The centerpiece of the small business bill is a provision increasing the expense election for equipment made by small business. Currently, businesses can deduct up to \$17,500 of equipment costs in the year of purchase. That limit will be raised to \$18,000 in 1997 and then gradually increased to \$25,000

The bill increases the minimum wage to \$4.75 effective October 1, 1996, with an additional increase to \$5.15 scheduled for Septem-

A group of expired tax breaks were extended by the bill. Some of the rules that apply to S corporations will change, including an increase in the number of shareholders allowed.

The bill also delays for six months the effective date for full implementation of the requirement that businesses make federal tax deposits electronically. Employers who deposited more than \$50,000 in taxes in 1995 were scheduled to begin electronic deposits by January 1, 1997. That deadline has been moved to July 1, 1997.

Beginning in 1997, deductible IRA contributions of up to \$2,000 will be allowed for each spouse (including a homemaker who does not work outside the home) if the combined com-pensation of both spouses is at least equal to the contributed amount and the contributions otherwise qualify.

The health insurance reform bill increases

the amount that self-employed individuals can deduct for the cost of health insurance. The current 30% deduction limit increases to 40% in 1997 and gradually increases to 80% by 2006.

Tax breaks are provided to encourage the purchase of long-term care insurance, and the bill also establishes a four-year pilot project to

test the deductible medical savings account.

It's going to be a new beginning for Cisco High School during the '95-'96 sports season. As a matter of fact, everything across the board, associated with sports will be different. including coaches.

Cisco fans are eager to learn the overall schematics of new Athletic Director and Head Football Coach

The native of Brownwood takes charge this season replacing former Athletic Director and Head Football Coach Rick Frazier who pursued a career in the professional Arena Football League as special teams and linebackers the Milwaukee Mustangs.

The new Distirct 11-2A high school will face opponents such as Pilot Point, Holliday, Krum and others who have experience at State Championship tournaments.


