EDITORIAL COMMENT

August 13

The city commission has called a city election for August 13 for the purpose of voting bonds for a sewer system for Bovina.

There are two sides to the question, like there are on every question. One school of thought is that the lack of a sewer system is hindering the growth of Bovina.

We don't know of any town that ever amounted to anything without a sewer but on the other hand, the town wouldn't double in size or in population overnight if we had one.

Some property owners feel that it would cost them too much money to tie onto the sewer. That argument can be counteracted by the fact that their property would increase in value if Bovina had a sewer.

We feel that a sewer system would be a definite asset for the town. One reason being that if the town continues to progress and grow, a sewer will have to become a part of it sooner or later.

However, in this election as in every other, the majority will rule and the main thing is to vote whether you are for or against a sewer system.

Now is a good time to start deciding whether you want Bovina to continue to progress or if you want to hinder its progress.

Resolution and Order For Bond Election

On This, the 26th day of July, 1955, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Bovina, Texas, convened in special session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the City Hall, there being present and in attendance the following members, to-wit:

O. W. Rhinehart, Mayor; Emmett Tabor, Commissioner; Paul Jones, Commissioner; and with the following absent: None, constituting a quorum; at which time the following, among other business was transacted, to-wit:

Commissioner Jones introduced a resolution and order and moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tabor. The motion, carrying with it the adoption of the resolution and order, prevailed by the following vote:

AYES: Mayor Rhinehart and Commissioners Tabor and Jones.  
 NOES: None.

The Resolution and Order is as follows:  
 WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Bovina, Texas, deems it advisable to issue the bonds of said City for the purpose hereinafter mentioned; therefore:

Be It Resolved And Ordered By The Board Of Commissioners Of The City Of Bovina, Texas:

I.  
 That an election be held on the 13th day of August, 1955, which date is not less than fifteen (15) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption of this resolution and order, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted to the qualified electors of said City who own taxable property therein and who have duly rendered the same for taxation:

"SHALL the Board of Commissioners of the City of Bovina, Texas, be authorized to issue ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) of revenue bonds of said City for the purpose of purchasing and constructing a Sanitary Sewer System in and for said City; said bonds to mature serially over a period of years not to exceed Thirty (30) years from their date, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed FOUR AND ONE-HALF PER CENTUM (4½%) per annum, payable annually or semi-annually; said revenue bonds to be special obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest solely from and secured by a first lien on and pledge of the revenues of the City's combined Waterworks and Sanitary Sewer System, after deduction of reasonable operation and maintenance expenses, as said expenses are defined by statute?"

II.  
 That said election shall be held at the City Hall, in the City of Bovina, Texas, and the entire City shall constitute one election precinct.

III.  
 That the following named persons are hereby appointed officers of the election, to-wit:  
 W. J. Parker, Presiding Judge; Troy Armstrong, Judge; J. D. Stevens, Clerk, and C. R. Elliott, Clerk.

IV.  
 That said election shall be held under the provisions of and in accordance with the laws governing the issuance of municipal bonds in cities, as provided in the General Laws of the State of Texas, and only qualified electors, who own taxable property in the City, and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be qualified to vote.

V.  
 That the ballots for said election shall be prepared in sufficient number and in conformity with Chapter 6, V. A. T. S. Election Code, adopted by the Fifty-second Legislature in 1951, and that printed on such ballots shall appear the following:

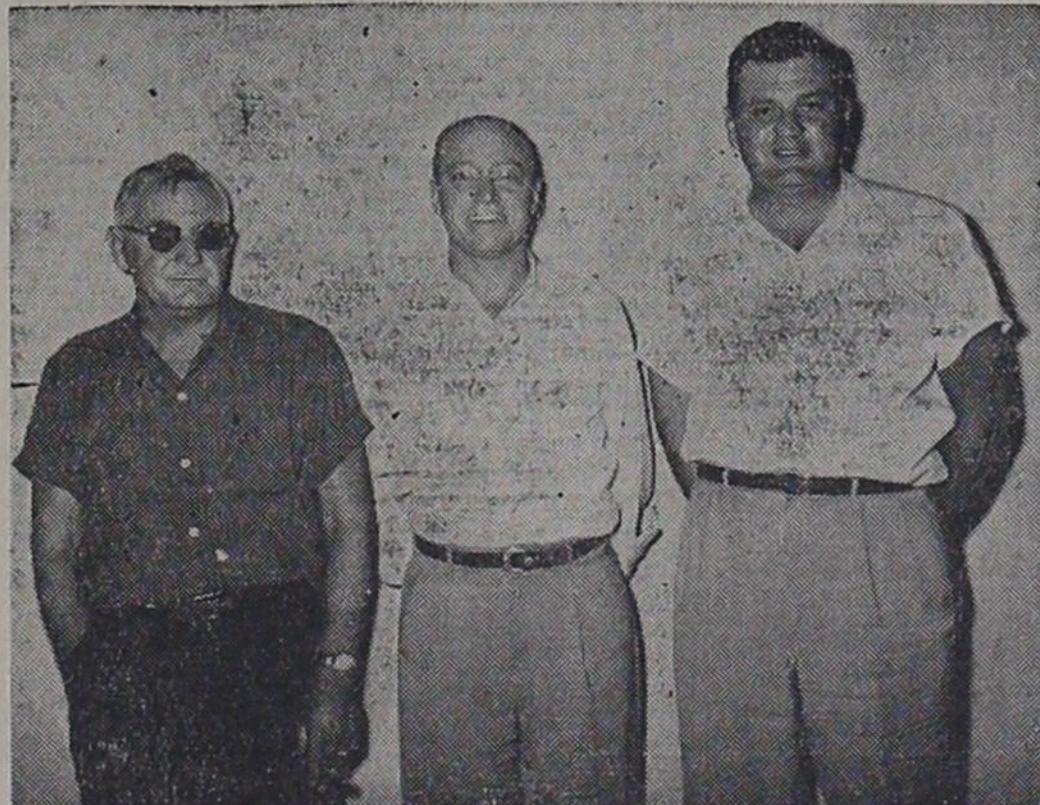
